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Poachers Cutting Down Deer In Michigan

Poaching in Michigan is causing a sharp loss to the deer herd with spring bringing an increase to the illegal practice of "shining" deer into immobility by use of auto spotlights.

E. E. Tucker, assistant head of the conservation department's law enforcement division, says that with back roads now open to the poachers' cars, nightly forays are bringing more and more original suits.

And with dogs carrying their young at present, threat to the deer herd by poachers is much increased. One recent case in Schoolcraft County brought two men to justice court after a doe bearing two fawns was found shot and abandoned in a field.

Tucker says that the problem of shining reaches a peak during summer months, but that it actually is a year-around enforcement problem.
