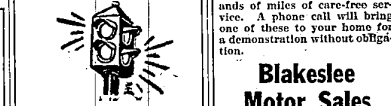

CHILD'S FEARS HEAVY TRAFFIC TOLL OVER HOLIDAY

With favorable weather, the volume of traffic on Michigan highways during the Fourth of July holiday period is expected to surpass all previous records and State Police Commissioner Joseph A. Childs is warning motorists to be alert and to drive likewise to an all-time high.

"The highest toll for the Fourth of July period in the state was 38 deaths in 1950," Childs said. "The lowest was eight in 1945."

"Last year the holiday came on a mid-week end, eliminating extended week end trips for most persons. But ten persons were killed on the Fourth and 32 during the previous week end, the worst week end of the 1951 summer season."

"This year the Fourth and the week end are combined into an extended holiday period. On the basis of last year's record we could have a new high fatality toll for the period. But we urge you to watch for a new high record in cars and caution are practiced. In 1952, there is no reason why a 1952 record cannot be as low - or lower - than the all-time low of 1945."

"Special efforts on the part of drivers to control speed would prevent many accidents and save lives. Speeding is the largest part of every five fatal traffic accidents."

"All other safe driving practices - also are drivers' responsibilities - are to be observed. Possibilities our accidents will be cut to a minimum."

The Commissioner also warned against the use of fireworks. "No matter where you go or what you do, never let fireworks play it safe. The Fourth is Independence Day. Celebrate it free of accidents."

OPEN FAMOUS INN AT GREENFIELD VILLAGE June 14

Greenfield Village's famous Clinton Inn, once a familiar landmark to travelers on the Old Sank, Trail, was reopened Saturday, June 14, to Village visitors for the summer months serving cafeteria-style meals.

Last year the Inn was opened to the public for the first time since its removal from Clinton, Michigan, to Greenfield Village in 1927. The Inn is staffed and operated by Village employees. Expert assistance and advice has been obtained from recreation specialists in the Tourist and Resort Program at Michigan State College, and a larger selection of home-cooked foods - many of them native Michigan favorites, will be offered the public this year. A new feature is a "bill of fare" similar to those obtained from a restaurant to spell "please use last week's fare sheet," which was used to discourage would-be dolesters from detaching the menu.

The Inn has been redecorated and restored to its original appearance in the 1830's when it served as the first overnight stage stop between Detroit and Chicago.
