Celebrating their golden wedding anniversary August twelfth are Mr. and Mrs. Harry N. McCracken of Farmington.

Mr. McCracken, who is eighty-seven years of age, was born in a log cabin on the site of his present farm home. His father and grandfather emigrated in a covered wagon to Michigan from Bennington, Vermont.

After completing his formal education in the local schools, Ypsilanti Normal and Valparaiso University, he taught in the Farmington Township schools for many years and during this period he served as Farmington's first superintendent of schools. From 1900 through 1902 he was editor and publisher of the Farmington Enterprise.

From 1902 until the present time he has been actively engaged in farming on the ancestral place at 35720 Twelve Mile Road. However, he found time during the period to be a member of the Michigan State Legislature for two terms in 1904 and 1906; the first agricultural agent for Oakland County in 1916; an organizer and promoter of the Farmington State Bank, the Mountain View Orchard at Romeo, Oakland Hills Subdivision in Farmington Township; and a holder of various township offices for many years, his present office being that of Township Clerk.

Mrs. McCracken was born in Pictou, Nova Scotia, in 1875, a daughter of Scotch emigrants. She has been for many years a member and worker in the Methodist Church as well as active in women's club activities.

There are three children, Harold at Detroit, Howard and Donald of Farmington and three grandchildren, Howard William, Jr., Patricia Ann and Charles.

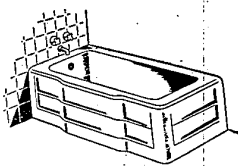
