Child Labor Record Keeping Made Easier

A simplification of the record-keeping provisions of the Fedral Fair Labor Standards Act apply-ing to children employed on farms during hours school is in session has been announced by William S. Singley of Cleveland, regional director of the U. S. Labor depart-ment's Wage and Hour and Pub-lic Contracts divisions.

ment's Wage and Hour and Public Contracts divisions.

Singley polated out that child labor on farms is exempt from provisions of the Act when school is not in session, but that the federal law prohibits employment of children under 16 years of age during hours school is in session. Under the amended regulations, Singley said, the farmer employing children 16 and 17 years of age during hours school is in session is required to record three items for each such child working on his farm. His record must show the child's name, his date of hirth, and the address of his permanent home as well as the address of his residence while working if the is not at his permanent home.
