Nearing the end of a survey of some 20 lakes reported being iam-prey infeated, the conservation department investigator thus far has narrowed the list to four lakes which have residential popula-tions. Guard says dams and oth-er barriers og connecting creaks and rivers appear to be dolog a good job of preventing the fish-ravishing lamprey from migrat-ing into inland fakes from the Great Lakes. "It seems fatrly certain that

Oreat Lakes. "It seems fairly certain that four inland lakes have established sea lamprey populations, but we want to recheck once more before publicy identifying them." Gaard explains. Residential populations of brook, silver or chestonut lam-preys have been found in some lakes, but he also points out that these species are not serious para-altes of game fish and should not cause alarm. cause alarm. Saven lakes have yet to be ex-amined before this investigation program of the department's fish-eries institute is finished. Guard yelates his tindings on other lakes which have been inves-tigated: Berrien County's Pipestone lake ... brook lammerey present

Berrien County's Pipestone lake — brook lampreys present but Lake Michigan sea lampreys apparently unable to get over dams on connecting creek and St Joseph River. Berrien County's Paw Paw lake

Berrien County's Paw Paw lake — chestuat lamprey population but no sea lampreys. Benzie County's Crystal lake— no sea lampreys coming in through the Betsey river because of dam

the Bettey river because of dam harrier. See lampreys or scarred fish have not been taken from the lake so far although eel-shaped parasites are known to have migrated into the connecting Carp River. Leelanau County's Glen lake Grystal River dam apparently is stopping the migrating lampreys. Antrim County's Sike, Round, Torch and Intermediate chain of takes — appear to be getting pro-tection from the Elk Rapids dam.
