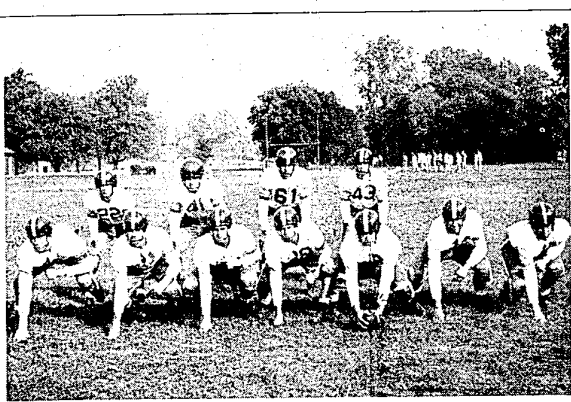

Enrollment In Farmington Schools Continues To Set New Records... Elementary Registration Reaches 1,820 Students With 938 Enrolled In The High School

Enrollment in the Farmington Township School District is continuing to increase, according to registration figures released this week by O. E. Dunkel, superintendent.

As of last Monday, enrollment in the elementary schools of the District totaled 1,820 students. This includes all students from kindergarten through the sixth grade.

Enrollment in the junior-senior high school totaled 938 as of Monday afternoon, Dunkel stated. This compares to 994 students recorded on the opening day.
