chigan, materials of cultural value in addition to those which the library itself can purchase or cause to be purchased from Library Funds; to act as trustee for the receipt, management, investment, disbursement, distribution and disposal of moneys or choses in action, goods or effects received by this corporation by way of gift or otherwise, for the general or specific use or benefit of said Public Library, in general, — to further the interests of said Public Library in other ways; and to further, in any lawful way, the establishment of adequate Public Library facilities for the City and Township of Farmington, Oakland County, Michigan.

A board of directors was elected as follows: Wendell Brown and Chester Downing for three year terms; Vilas Bates, David Pressley and Clarence Stoll for two year terms; Mrs. R. M. Gringer and W. Allen Nelson for one year terms. Mrs. Margaret Leach as librarian is also a director.

Mr. Vilas Bates was designated temporary treasurer to accept dues and set up a charter member list. Any person or group joining Farmington Friends of the Library before January 1, 1953, will be a charter member. Mrs. Florence Leach and Mrs. Mildred Drooge, Farmington librarians, are designated as agents to accept such applications for membership. Any one desiring membership in the organization is asked to contact these persons.

The board of directors will meet, elect officers, sign the articles of incorporation and send them to the state.

Condition City Streets For Winter Season

ALGER BRINGS G.O.P. CAMPAIGN TO OAKLAND COUNTY

Secretary of State Fred M. Alger Jr. tonight hit his "Save Michigan" campaign into southern Oakland County on Friday, September 19, on a hand-shaking tour aimed at taking his fight for the governorship "right to folks who will make the decision."

The Republican gubernatorial candidate toured New Hudson, South Lyon, Novi, Farmington, Royal Oak, Ferndale and Oak Park in the first campaign invasion of Oakland County since the August primary.

"I've only started to fight in this campaign to save Michigan from the slipshod, inefficient and reckless spending of Governor Williams' administration," Alger assured listeners.

"When the people know the facts of Governor Williams' bungling of the Jackson prison riots, his callous refusal to help balance the state's budget, and his practice of talking out of both sides of his mouth on important issues, I'm sure they will help us kick him out of Lansing," Alger said.

Alger and Congressman George A. Dondero of Royal Oak led a slate of GOP candidates for Oakland and offices in a motorcycle tour highlighted by hand-shaking walks down factory aisles at Michigan Seamless Tube Company in South Lyon and Reichbach Chemical Company, Allegheny-Ludlum Steel Corporation, Republic Steel Corporation and Peninsular Metal Products Corporation in Ferndale.

At Tom's Market in Royal Oak, Alger dramatized the high cost of living by taking a five dollar bill and showing how much it could buy under Democratic administration. He bought what he expected would be a five-dollar purchase and when the cashier rang up the total it was for \$7.20. Michigan face each day when they try to feed their families," Alger commented.

Representative Dondero, candidate for Congress, and Donald J. Brown of Ferndale, who seeks to represent Oakland County's fifth state legislative district, and George N. Higginbotham, candidate for state senator, were at Alger's side during the tour.
