Traditions Join In Schoolcraft Agape Feast

An agape feast—joining the traditions of the Jewish Seder and the Christian Last Supper—highlighted campus observance of the Passover and Easter season at Schoolcraft College.

The meal for 50 was served Thursday, April 19, in the Newman Center on campus. Now a small tradition in its own right for Schoolcraft and the Newman Center, it is described by Sister Margaret Basso, advisor, as "a feast celebrating God's showing his love for man."

Passover wines, matzo, bitter herbs and spring lamb prepared by the students in the college culinary arts program are featured in the meal.

As the feast proceeds, all at the table participate in liturgies beginning with the lighting of the festival lights, continuing through the Kiddush, the blessing of the feast, and the Hagadah, the story of the deliverance from Egypt, and reaching the bread and wine of the Christian communion ceremony.

At the end of the meal, all present sing a hymn, "God is love and he who abides in love abides in God and God in him."

The Rev. Dennis Bagley, campus minister for Lawrence Institute of Technology, assisted the Newman Center staff in the event.

Mormons Will Attend Classes

Mormons in the Detroit metropolitan area will have an opportunity to take college-level classes in the Livonia Chapel, Six Mile and Merriman, April 23 and 24. The classes will begin at 12 noon and run through 10 p.m.

Church members 14 years and older have an opportunity once a year to attend college classes conducted in Mormon chapel buildings.

Mormon leaders in Salt Lake City use Brigham Young University professors on a traveling basis as classroom instructors. The university, located in Provo, Utah, is the largest private college in the U.S. today. It is owned and operated exclusively by the Mormon Church.

The need for constant education, one of the basic concepts of Mormonism, and church programs are designed to teach members

from the cradle to the grave. Even three-year-old children are given special speaking instruction to give them confidence when their turn comes to speak to the congregation. There is no paid clergy in the church, and all sermons must be given by church members.

Two seminars for young people who plan to spend their summer in missionary work and graduation ceremonies for 90 missionaries high-light activities this spring at Missionary Internship, Inc., 36200 Freedom Road, Farmington.

The seminars are scheduled for April 27-28 and May 1-5 in Galilee Baptist Church, 28875 W. Seven Mile, Livonia.
