An agape feast-joining the traditions of the Jewish Seder and the Christian Last Supper-highlighted campus observance of the Passover and Easter season at Schoolcraft College.

The meal for 50 was served Thursday, April 19, in the Newman Center on campus. Now a small tradition in its own right for Schoolcraft and the Newman Center, it is described by Sister Margaret Basso, advisor, as "a feast celebrating God's showing his love for man."

Passover wines, matzo, bitter herbs and spring lamb prepared by the students in the college culinary arts program are featured in the meal.

As the feast proceeds, all at the table participate in liturgies beginning with the lighting of the festival lights, continuing through the Kiddush, the blessing of the feast, and the Hagadah, the story of the deliverance from Egypt, and reaching the bread and wine of the Christian communion ceremony.

At the end of the meal, all present sing a hymn, "God is love, and he who abides in love abides in God and God in him."
