Garden Calendar

poppies, bachelor buttons, California poppies, etc.

APRIL

Crocuses usher in the month, and daffodils and forsythia see it out.

It's a busy month. Begin by sowing seed indoors to get a head start with tender vegetables such as tomatoes and peppers and flowers such as petunias. Plant deciduous trees and shrubs, roses. Seed lawns.

Sow seeds of hardy vegetables such as peas, radishes, beets, onions. Sow hearty annuals outdoors, including sweet alyssum, coreopsis, asters.

MAY

Tulips and lilacs, dogwood and flowering crobs make May sheer delight.

Plant needle evergreens and broad leaf evergreens. Planting of trees, shrubs and roses can continue with "container grown" plants. Plant perennials.

Frost is not likely after mid - May.

so-it-is safe then to plant seeds of tender vegetables such as beans, squash and corn and those of tender flowers such as petunias, marigolds and zinnias. By the end of the month it is safe to set out the tender little vegetables and annual plants.

AUGUST

Keep cool.

Do chores when beds are shaded. If perennials are lank and leggy cut them back and they will soon be bushy and full of blooms again. Crede and prepare ground for new lawns early in August and seed them after a few weeks setting time. Dry flowers for lasting winter bouquets.

SEPTEMBER

Summer ends with a final burst of glory from annuals.

It is planting time again for evergreens and perennials. Keep harvesting vegetables and fruits. Plant little bulbs for early Spring bloom.

Move out buy mums for a bright display. Bring house plants inside. Be prepared for frost by the end of the month.

JUNE

This is the month of roses and also iris, delphinium, lilies and a bright array of other perennials.

Finish setting out bedding plants of geraniums, begonias and annuals. There is still time to sow seeds of fast growing annuals such as marigolds, phlox, sweet alyssum. In the vegetable garden replant rows when the early crops of lettuce, radishes and onions are harvested.

Plant tender summer flower bulbs including dahlias, gladioli, begonias. Keep grass mowed and put the clippings on a compost pile. Spray roses and feed them regularly. Move house plants to the patio or porch for a summer outing.

JULY

Hammock time - relax and enjoy!

Harvest vegetables as they ripen. Keep the yard and garden tidy. Water if there is a dry spell. Check for bugs and diseases and take action if necessary with safe, approved "killers."

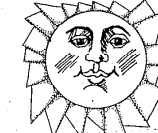
Plant seeds of perennials.

OCTOBER

This is Nature's final fling with blazing foliage and bright mums.

It's clean - up month in yard and garden. Rake leaves and put them on the compost pile. Lift tender bulbs and tubers of gladioli, dahlias, etc. to store indoors. Pull spent plants from the garden and turn the soil in the vegetable garden and in empty flower beds.

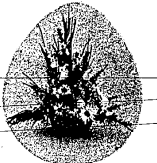
Plant fall bulbs, tulips and lily bulbs. Plant trees and shrubs. "Hill" roses before the ground freezes. Finally, when all the other jobs are done, clean the tools and put them away along with patio furniture. Now is the time to check back, note your successes and failures and begin to make plans again for next year.
