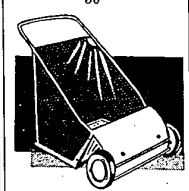

**SENIOR CLASS NOW LEADS ROLL OF HONOR**

With the addition of five seniors to the first honor roll at Farmington High, the twelfth grade gained the distinction of having the largest percentage of any class on the list, 22% of 108 members.

Those names added were: A. Brown, D. Monk, J. Smith, P. Gowers and W. Tamm. In addition, the senior class placed only 3% on the failure list.

The eighth grade, a class of 196, had 18% on the honor roll to place second. However, a duplicate distinction is theirs 15% on the failure list.

The freshman class of 163 members placed 16% on the honor roll and 13% on the failure list.

The seventh grade had 15% of 134 students on the honor list while having only 6% on the failing list.

In fifth place were the sophomores with 14% of their total of 146 members. Nevertheless this class held the honor of placing the least percentage of any class on the failure list with 2%.

The seventh grade came in last with only 8% of 192 students with B or better marks. Ten percent of this class was also listed as failures.

As a whole the school had 15% of the total enrollment of 939 on the honor roll and 8.7% on the failure list.

English proved to be the most difficult high school subject with a total of 24 failures; 14 of these were freshmen. English is required for three years in high school and a fourth year is optional.

Other failures were spread over a wide area of subjects including science, social studies, commercial courses, music, language, math, physical education and home economics.
