Health Doctor Warns Of Dangers Arising From Neglect Of Common Cold

Colds are on the increase as is usual in the first nippy days of fall because people are crowded indoors, Dr. Joseph G. Molner, Detroit commissioner of health, tells us. Before the winter is over all most every man, woman and child in the area will have had a cold and some persons as many as four.

Because most colds occur in winter, for generations people have believed that colds were caused directly by exposure to stormy weather. This is not true. Instead, they are infectious diseases caused by one of several viruses. Drops of secretion from coughs, sneezes, sooty handkerchiefs or cleaning tissue carry the virus from the cold sufferer so that he gives his cold to others. Most often the victim takes in the virus with the air he breathes, but it can be passed by direct contact from hand to mouth.

The fellow with the cold is the most dangerous to people about him. The first hours of his infection, often while he is still wondering if he is "coming down with a cold". He continues to be a source of danger for about three or four days.

A cold may seem little more than a nuisance but its real importance is in the complications which so often follow. Some of these lead to chronic diseases such as sinus infection.

School children and adults who work have no practical means of entirely escaping colds. They cannot isolate themselves. Invalids, frail, elderly people and babies should be kept away from every one who has a cold.

To protect yourself and others from colds, keep these things in mind:

Keep your general health high by getting plenty of rest, eating regular, well-balanced meals and enjoying the kind of recreation which keeps you fit; this includes avoiding exercise that is too strenuous.

Avoid getting too tired, over-heated or chilled.

Dress according to the weather. If your head stops up, your eyes burn, your head aches, you are not and ache all over, go home and stay there until your fever has gone down. If rest in bed does not clear up the symptoms, call your doctor and follow his advice rather than trying to treat yourself.

Dr. Molner says that colds are no respecter of age. They are responsible for the loss of 50 times as many work days as are lost because of accidents. A recent study made by the United States Public Health Service revealed the common cold as the leading cause of sickness in young babies.

PROPOSITIONS

Also for the purpose of voting upon the following propositions:

Proposal No. 1
PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO SECTION 10 OF ARTICLE II, RELATIVE TO THE SEARCH AND SEIZURE PROVISION OF THE MICHIGAN CONSTITUTION TO PERMIT THE USE AS EVIDENCE IN CRIMINAL PROCEEDINGS OF NARCOTIC DRUGS SEIZED IN VIOLATION THEREOF.

Amendment proposed by joint resolution adopted by the legislature to Section 10 of Article II of the Michigan Constitution, which protects persons and their possessions against unreasonable searches and seizures, by barring the introduction in evidence of property obtained in violation thereof, so as to permit the introduction in evidence, in criminal proceedings, of narcotic drugs seized anywhere except in dwellings, although obtained without a search warrant or lawful arrest, the same as dangerous weapons are now so permitted to be introduced in evidence in criminal proceedings.

Proposal No. 2
PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO SECTIONS 2, 3 AND 4 OF THE MICHIGAN CONSTITUTION TO PROVIDE FOR DECENAL REAPPORTIONMENT OF THE SENATE AND HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES BY THE SECRETARY OF STATE.

Initiatory petition proposing to amend Sections 2, 3 and 4 of Article V of State Constitution to provide reapportionment of the state legislature, according to latest federal census, by secretary of state, enforceable through mandamus proceedings in supreme court of Michigan. Senate shall consist of thirty-three members elected from single member districts created according to population formula in amendment, and house of representatives shall consist of sixty-nine members elected from districts created according to population formula in amendment, with three representative districts allocated to each senatorial district, senate and house members to be elected for two year terms.

Proposal No. 3
PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO SECTIONS 2, 3 AND 4 OF THE MICHIGAN CONSTITUTION TO ESTABLISH SENATORIAL DISTRICTS AND TO PROVIDE FOR DECENAL REAPPORTIONMENT OF REPRESENTATIVES BY LEGISLATURE OR BY STATE BOARD OF CANVASSERS.

Initiatory petition proposing to amend Sections 2, 3 and 4 of Article V of State Constitution to provide for reapportionment of the state legislature. Provides for a senate consisting of thirty-four members elected for two year terms from single member districts established in the amendment. Provides for a house consisting of not to exceed one hundred and ten members elected for two year terms from districts created by the legislature according to population formula in amendment. Legislature shall reapportion house according to latest federal census. If legislature fails to reapportion, state board of canvassers must do so.

Section 1. On the day of any election the polls shall be opened at 7 o'clock in the forenoon and shall be continued open until 8 o'clock in the afternoon and no longer. Every qualified elector present and in line at the polls at the hour prescribed for the closing thereof shall be allowed to vote.
