Proposed Amendment to section 10 of article II, Relative to the search and seizure provision of the michigan constitution, to fermit the use as evidence in cerninal proceedings of narcotio drugs selezed in violation thereof.

DRUGS SEIZED IN VIOLATION THEREOF.

Initiatory petition proposing to amend Sections 2, 3 and 4 of Article V of State Constitution to provide for apportionment of the state legislature. Provides for a senate consisting of thirty-four members elected for two year terms from single member districts established in the amendment. Provides for a house consisting of not to exceed one hundred and ten members elected for two year terms from districts created by the legislature according to population formulae in amendment. Legislature shall reappartion house according to latest federal census. If legislature falls to reapportion, state board of canvassers must do so.
