Open New Areas For Spear Fishing

More than 120 lakes and streams were opened to the spearfishing of muskies, whitefish, suckers and carp on November 1, adding to the list of 15 that opened October 15, the conservation department reports.

All the waters will remain open through December 31. Fish may be any size, and there is no catch limit except seven on whitefish. Artificial light may be used. Whitefish and muskies so taken cannot be sold. Spearfishing allows a more adequate harvest of these fish types.

LUDINGTON CITIZENS GIVE STATE PARK MAJOR OVERHAUL

"Operation Facelit", a mammoth renovation project, went off like clockwork at Ludington state park, recently when 800 persons turned out as volunteer workers. Townspeople turned painters, carpenters, truck drivers and general laborers gave the park a go-over that won't be forgotten in Ludington for a long time.

The bathhouse - a two-story structure, 126 by 40 feet - was painted in just under three hours. Another crew dug holes, creosoted and placed 400 marker posts in about three hours to keep pace with the bathhouse painters.

Forest cutting and thinning operations, which crews accomplished with chainsaws, knocked more than 250 trees out of the park in short order.

At luncheon, the entire work force was fed in one hour by a group of 75 church women and Girl Scouts. The 800 workers consumed 150 gallons of coffee, three bushels of potato salad, 125 pounds of beans, 250 pounds of meatloaf, 30 jars of pickles and 60 cakes.

After lunch, the crews went back to their 30 projects. Two of the largest kept two big crane bulldozers and numerous trucks busy, flattening sand dunes into beach area and filling low points in group camp and picnic areas throughout the park.

Heavy equipment was donated by trucking firms, Ludington's street department and the Mason City Road commission. And all County road construction and equipment, materials and labor were donated without monetary return.

The project was organized after a prison work camp proposed for the area failed to materialize.

HUNTING SEASON WILL ALLEVIATE HERD PROBLEMS

Several hunting clubs with lands in the northern-lower peninsula are looking forward to the coming deer season as at least a partial answer to their deer management problems, the conservation department reports.

For a number of years, these clubs have asked department aid in solving deer problems. Timber cutting and plantings and controlled burnings usually have been advised. Similar procedures are employed by the department in attempting to manage deer on public lands.

However, outstated deer herds during recent years have killed much of the effect of this work by overbrowsing.

But this year the clubs hope to harvest many stunted does and fawns during the "any deer" season - the final three days - of the coming season. By this action, they expect to give food supplies a chance to grow back and to bring generally better health to remaining deer.

More manure is returned to the farm from the loose housing herd than from the stanchion herd, according to Michigan State College specialists.
