ROBERT BACON NAMED ALL-MIAA TACKLE AT ALMA

Alma College, the MIAA's hard luck football team of 1952, has had three players selected on this year's All-MIAA football squad. They are, Bob Naru, fullback, from Detroit Catholic Central High School; Bob Bacon, tackle, from Farmington; and Pat Shaw, halfback, from Mantua, Michigan. All three stars are seniors who expect to graduate in June. Also, each player has won four letters with the Scots, one for each gridiron season at the College.

Bob Bacon, the son of Mr. and Mrs. Reynolds Bacon of 33438 Shawassaw, has compiled one of the most impressive records in the history of the college at the tackle slot. Bacon is Coach Eaton's second two-way platoon player besides Naru on the team. His loss will be felt heavily in the line next year. Bacon is an extremely fast man for a tackle, despite his five-foot seven inch stature and heavy two-hundred pound frame. He gained notable distinction in the Hillsdale game this year when his efficient and effective blocking paved the way for fullback Bob Naru to gallop over for one of his two touchdowns of that game. Following graduation Bob plans to go into teaching and coaching football.

Bacon presents a position-filling problem for coach Eaton. How- ever, Bill Waspser of Mason, Jim Hahn of Alma and Nares Gedgan of Dearborn are eligible for Bacon's position.

HIGH SCHOOL BASKETBALL RULES CHANGED

Several new high school basketball rules will be introduced to the Farmington cage fans when the Falcons open their season with Wayne on Tuesday night, December 9.

There are about nine new rules, most of them minor changes in old ones. The foul shooting rule has been changed drastically. The right to waive a foul and take the ball out of bounds has been cancelled. A foul against a player shooting at the basket will be the same as last year; one shot if the field goal is successful and two shots if the attempt is unsuccessful.

Any foul in the last three minutes is treated as an intentional foul with two shots to the offended player. A personal foul which is not against a field goal thrower and which is not during the last three minutes and is not intentional will award the offended player one shot. A second free throw is awarded if the first is unsuccessful.

Double fouls carry the same penalty as last year, two shots.

BRIGHTON HIGH ENTERS LEAGUE AGAINST TROJANS

The Brighton "Bulldogs" will plunge headlong into Wayne-Oakland League competition this fall when Coach Hy Klein's quintet opens its basketball season.

After three non-league contests the Bulldogs open league play by traveling to Clarenceville on December 12. Due to the fact that the Brighton football squad does not enter league competition until next year, this contest will be the occasion of the Bulldogs' first competition in the Wayne-Oakland League play.

Coach Hy Klein has six returning lettermen from last year's squad which closed fast the latter half of the season, winning eight out of its last ten contests. Sparking the Bulldogs will be its captain, Dick Stoner and Tom Evenson. Stoner is a clever, hard-driving guard, and a key playmaker in the Brighton attack. Evenson, a six foot three inch talented center, tallied 253 points last season for a 17 point average per game. He is equally adept at shooting from the post or from outside and this fact makes him a particularly dangerous scoring threat. In addition, Evenson captured better than 40 per cent of his team's rebounds and he expects in this phase of play. He is certain to receive serious consideration for All-State honors before the season closes.

Coach Klein drilled the Bulldogs hard in the early drills in preparation for the opening contest. At that time the Brighton squad traveled to Ann Arbor for a clash with the Ann Arbor U-High "Cubs".

Trojan Quintet Meets Bentley In Season Opener

The Clarenceville Trojans opened their 1952-53 basketball season Tuesday, December 2, when they met the Bentley Bulldogs on the Bentley floor.

Coach Robert Selke stated that the team had been shaping up nicely and that they showed good form in their first scrimmage against Redford Union on Wednesday, November 26. Starting players for the Bentley game were Bob Townsley at center, Glen Evans and Jim Merriam as forwards and Pat Killison and Tom Rutledge at guards. Coach Selke has rounded out his squad and intends to carry ten men through the season. The remaining players on the roster are Koch, Myers, Phillips, Robbins, Vandenberg and Zavitz.

The Trojans will meet South Lyon in the second game of the season on Friday, December 5. This game will be played on the Trojan home floor beginning at 7:00 p.m.

The Clarenceville reserve team will open their season Tuesday night as they encountered the Bentley junior varsity. Coach Marra intends to carry fourteen boys in the squad this year.

Coach William Waters stated that the newly formed freshman basketball team will open its season on Tuesday, December 9, when they meet the Farmington Falcons. Coach Waters stated that he is still undecided about his possible starters for this game.

Wrestling Card To Benefit Blind

Leader Dogs for the Blind at Rochester will be the principal beneficiary of the wrestling program to be presented by Promoter Harry Light and Matchmaker Rudy Hart at the City Arena, Woodward at Forest, on Monday night, December 8.

The training school for Leader Dogs will get 25 per cent of the gate after taxes. The promotion is a nationally-conducted affair, initiated by Ed "Strangler" Lewis, who was blind for 13 years, and LeRoy McGulrk, former National Wrestling Champion. Light, a high weight champion, who lost his sight in an automobile accident two years ago.

Thanksgiving week was devoted to the fund-raising campaign in most of the nation's mat centers, but because the Lions Club in the Detroit area had other programs to benefit the blind during that time, Light and Hart agreed to work until next Monday night to present their benefit wrestling show.

Barto, who is better known as promoter of demolition races at Motor City Speedway, combined talents with Light in the promotion of wrestling in the new downtown Detroit sports center several weeks ago.

The two impresarios plan to present the best mat talent available and the Leader Dog show will be no exception. Barto has signed Ruffy Silverstein, regarded as the uncrowned heavyweight champion, to meet Don Arnold of Hollywood in the two in three falls, 36-minute time limit feature match.

Silverstein is a former University of Illinois star who won the Big Ten wrestling championship three times and in addition, the AAU championship twice and the National Collegiate once. Arnold, too, is a former intercollegiate champion (San Diego State). He won the Pacific Coast and Junior National AAU mat titles.

Three other bouts are on the program, the first at 8:30 p.m.
