Change File Date For Tax Forms

The deadline date for the return of City personal property statements has been changed from January 15 to January 20, James Tennant, City Manager and Assessor, announced this week.

The extension of time is being allowed because of unavoidable delays in getting the forms mailed out to city business and industrial establishments. Tennant stated that the statements are being mailed out this week to all stores and plants in the city. The forms should thus be filled out and returned to the Assessor at the Municipal Building on or before January 20.

Tennant pointed out that for the first time personal property statements will be reviewed by an Oakland County tax auditor sometime following the deadline. The assessment of real property in the city is expected to begin in the next few weeks.

The Assessor emphasized that Veterans Homestead Exemption claims must be filed on or before March 1, 1955. Applications will be available at the City Clerk's office after Monday, January 17, 1955. The mechanical drawing disability from the Veterans Administration, presently in the Armed Forces or who have been separated from the service since January 1, 1952, are eligible for exemption. Tennant explained that in any of the three cases persons must present proof before the exemption is granted. The application must be either verified by the assessor or signed by a Notary Public.

ing and Home Finance Agency. The new school building is being constructed with the aid of Federal Funds. The contract for the architectural work was awarded to the Smith and Andrews Company of Detroit. The mechanical contract was awarded to Lloyd S. Thornton Company, Birmingham, and the electrical contract to the NorWest Electric Company of Detroit. Total contract price of the composite of the various successful bidders, is \$203,703. The Federal Government has authorized a sum of \$215 for the construction portion of the project. Approval for the transfer of approximately \$38,900 from the 1948 Debt Fund to the Building and Site Fund was recently approved by the state. This sum will be used to meet the balance needed for the construction work.

POST OFFICE ASKS RESIDENTS TO FILE NEW ADDRESS CARD

Charles Habermehl, Farmington Postmaster, urged all residents of the City of Livonia who formerly received mail through the Farmington Post Office to return their change of address cards as soon as possible.

The Postmaster stated that most of the cards have now been distributed, and many of them have already been returned. The change of address is required now that the new Post Office has been completed in Livonia. Residents in the northern section of Livonia received their mail formerly through the Farmington Post Office.

Habermehl stated that an early return of the cards will insure more prompt delivery of mail and packages to Livonia residents. At the present time a shuttle system is being used between the Farmington and the new Livonia Post Office.

ed painting when he was about 13 years old but that recent illness gave new impetus to his urge to put scenes on canvas. Altogether, he estimates that his years of work have resulted in around 1500 paintings, which, according to Pursar, have been produced with no formal training as a background.

Some of his latest paintings were done in Arizona when Pursar visited that state last fall. During that time he did a scene of the four peaks at Roosevelt Dam, a desert scene near Tucson, and a landscape of an area in Missouri along Route 60.

Although Mr. Pursar stresses that he paints primarily for his own enjoyment, many of his paintings have been sold — some to buyers in California who seem to prefer contrasting Michigan scenes.

Wherever the Pursars go, and they travel extensively, Mr. Pursar comes up with many ideas for canvases and makes pencil sketches for future reference. The remainder of his time on these excursions is spent behind the rod and reel.

Mrs. Pursar, for her part, is very proud of the artist of the family and spends her time on the trips by adding to her rock collection — which is a story in itself.


