**50 MEMBERS HELP A.A.U.W. CELEBRATE 71st BIRTHDAY**

The Farmington Branch of the American Association of University Women held a tea to celebrate the seventy-first anniversary of the founding of the organization at the home of Mrs. Paul Calkins, 23230 Power Road Wednesday afternoon, January 14. At that time fourteen new members of the Branch were honored.

Miss Ruth Bailey, Historian, reviewed the highlights of A.A.U.W. founding and distinguished past. Mrs. Paul Calkins told of the organization of the local branch and Mrs. George Nahstoll discussed membership in the Farmington Branch, which numbers nearly 50, and its start March 5, 1951, at which time nearly forty women met with a state officer and decided to form a local chapter. Formal recognition of the local group came in August of 1951 from the State and National organizations. One of the community projects which the local branch sponsored last year was a series of meetings to discuss the local library situation and as a result of the study the new organization of the Friends of the Library was accomplished. At the present time the chapter is sponsoring a Little Theatre Group, open to anyone in the community, which will present a play in the near future.
