

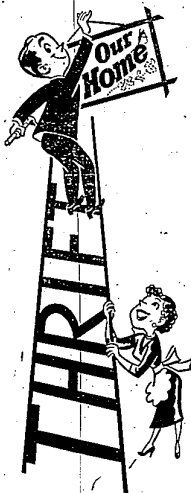
Pfc. Kahrl Finishes Sixth Month In Korea

Army Pfc. Robert B. Kahrl, son of Mr. and Mrs. A. C. Kahrl of 35516 State Street, recently completed his sixth month in Korea with the 7th Infantry Division. The 7th has fought continuously in Korea since its landing at Incheon in the fall of 1950. During its two years of combat in the mountainous terrain the division has battled in every sector of the peninsula. Elements of the 7th were the only U. S. forces to reach the Yalu River.

Kahrl is serving as a cannoneer in Battery B of the division's 31st Field Artillery Battalion. Before entering the Army in September, 1951, he graduated from the Farmington High School, Class of 1948, and was employed by Rex Builders in Farmington.

SOLDIER COMPLETES PARATROOPER TESTS AT FORT BENNING

Pvt. Lawrence B. Sandnes, son of Mr. and Mrs. O. Sandnes of 30743 Grand River, recently completed his training as a paratrooper at Fort Benning, Georgia. He arrived at the base on November 9, 1952.

Sandnes attended Farmington High School before entry into the Armed Forces. The course he has completed is designed to train volunteer officers and enlisted personnel from all arms and branches of the service as qualified paratroopers. Students are required to make five jumps from an airplane in flight, including one with full equipment.

The airborne course is but one of 21 at the Infantry School open to officers and enlisted men of the Regular Army, Organized Reserve and National Guard. Courses range from training recruits to become paratroopers to training regimental commanders and division general staff officers.

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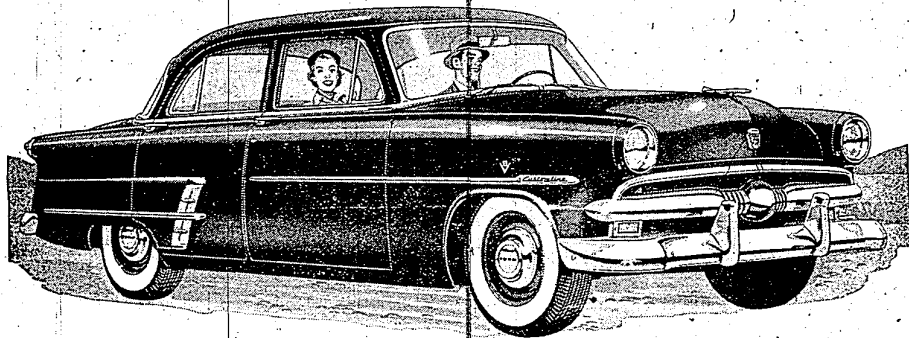
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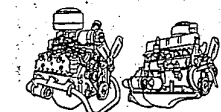
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
