Reciprocal Electrical Ordinance For Farmington Township

RESOLUTION TO ADOPT THE TOWNSHIP OF FARMINGTON, OAKLAND COUNTY, MICHIGAN

That the Township Board of Farmington Township, Oakland County, Michigan, do hereby adopt the following Electrical Ordinance for the Township of Farmington, Oakland County, Michigan, on the 27 day of January, 1953.

Section 6 RE-INSPECTION A. The Electrical Inspector may make periodic inspection of the installation of all electrical wiring, electric devices and electric equipment installed within the Township of Farmington, Oakland County, Michigan, and in the City of Farmington, Oakland County, Michigan, on the 27 day of January, 1953.

Section 7 CONSTRUCTION REQUIREMENTS A. No certificate of inspection shall be issued unless the electrical installation is in conformity with the provisions of this ordinance, the statutes of the State of Michigan, the regulations of the Public Utilities Commission under the authority of the State of Michigan, and the rules and regulations established as hereinafter provided.

Section 8 APPROVED MATERIALS A. It shall be unlawful to install or use any electrical device, apparatus, or equipment designed for attachment to or installation on any electrical circuit or system for heat, light or power that is not of good design and construction and is in conformity with the provisions of this ordinance.

Section 9 RECORD AND REVIEW A. The Inspection Authority shall keep complete and accurate records of all inspections made and other official work performed under the provisions of this ordinance.

Section 10 RIGHT OF ACCESS TO BUILDINGS A. The Electrical Inspector and/or his deputy shall have the right during reasonable hours to enter any building in the discharge of his official duties or for the purpose of making any inspection or test of the installation of electric wiring, electric devices and electric equipment contained therein and shall have the authority to cause the turning off of all electric supply and cut or disconnect, in cases of emergency, any wire where such electrical currents are dangerous to life or property.

Section 11 PERMITS A. No alterations or additions shall be made in the existing wiring of any building, nor shall any building be wired for the installation of any electric lights, motors, heating devices, or any apparatus requiring the use of electrical current at a potential over 30 volts, nor shall any alterations be made in the wiring in any building or in the installation of electrical equipment, without first notifying the Inspection Authority and securing a permit therefor.

Section 12 INSPECTION A. Upon the completion of the wiring of any building, shall be the duty of the person, firm or corporation installing the same to notify the Inspection Authority, who shall notify the Electrical Inspector to inspect the installation as soon as possible.

Section 13 REPEAL OF CONFLICTING ORDINANCES A. All ordinances or parts of ordinances conflicting with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

Section 14 LIABILITY A. This ordinance shall not be construed to relieve from or lessen the responsibility or liability of any person, firm or corporation, controlling or installing any electric wiring, electric devices and/or electric material for damages to person or property caused by any defect therein nor shall the Township of Farmington, Oakland County, Michigan, be held as assuming any such liability by reason of the inspection authorized herein or certificate of inspection issued as hereinafter provided.
