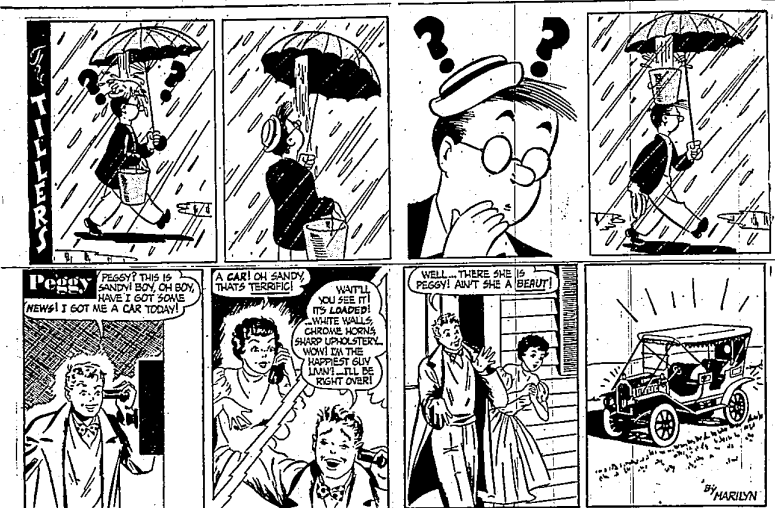




Ticklers By George Takes Two To Tangle, Conservationist Finds
