LEGAL NOTICE

ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 52 OF ARTICLE IV OF ORDINANCE NUMBER C-23-49 KNOWN AS TRAFFIC ORDINANCE.


That Section 55 (b) 1. of Article IV of Ordinance C-23-48 be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

Twenty-five (25) miles per hour on all streets in business districts; twenty-five (25) miles per hour on all streets in residence districts; and twenty-five (25) miles per hour in public parks, unless a different speed is fixed by the City Council and duly posted, except that no person shall drive any motor vehicle track on Shiawassee Road between Orchard Lake Road and the eastern line of the City limits at a speed greater than (10) miles per hour.

This ordinance shall become effective on March 26, 1953.

Passed and enacted by the Regular Meeting of the Council of the City of Farmington on the 16th day of March, A. D. 1953.

WOMEN'S BOWLING TOURNEY RECORDS 5,000 ENTRIES

Detroit has set another record in bowling annals. Final reports from the national secretary, Mrs. Emma Phaler, of the Woman's International Bowling Congress, reveal a total team entry in the 1952-53 national tournament to be held in Detroit of 5,000 teams.

Comparing this with the two largest previous tournaments on record, it is found that Detroit's entries eclipse the total number of teams (2,900) entered in the 1949 tournament in Columbus, Ohio, by 2,103 teams, and the total of 5,405 is above the total entry of 4,261 teams of doubles and 1,922 singles.

The local entry record of 1810 teams made by St. Louis last year was surpassed by 1033 teams in Detroit with our local entry figure set at 2843.

Naturally, the prize list will be the largest to date with \$138,132. Last year in St. Louis, the prize list amounted to \$85,000.

The team event is to be run on 44 alleys at the Detroit Recreation Club, in itself, is a record as it is the largest number of alleys ever to be used for the U. S. B. C. tournament. It is four more than were used for the 1949 and A. B. C. tournament held in Detroit a few years ago.

The event will open on April 9 and run through June 7. During this period, 10,785 women from practically every state in the Union as well as Canada, Alaska, Hawaii and the Panama Canal Zone, will journey to Detroit to take part in this tournament.

During the convention week, which starts about April 18, various social affairs will be held. The Detroit Woman's Bowling Association will host the "Open House" on Saturday evening, April 18, in the Coral Room of the Port Shelby Hotel.

This type of meet is held for intrasquad competition and will feature five events - half mile race, broad jump, high jump, shot put, and 100 yard dash.
