




ing politics and go along in giving it an "immediate" effect when it comes back to the House in the next few days, as it surely will since it is of such vital importance that every effort will be put forth to keep it alive.

The one hope in keeping it alive is the one that the House can act on it, and the Senate can't act on it in our amendment, or amend our amendment. In either of which case, the bill must come back into our possession before it can be ordered enrolled and presented to the Governor. But bear in mind, without immediate effect the bill is absolutely useless.

We will do everything we can to secure the Senate's two-thirds vote for "L.D.", but the escapable fact remains that at least one more vote is necessary in the House. If we cannot get that one vote, and the schools go without money and the teachers are unpaid, the responsibility will rest squarely upon the shoulders of the Democratic minority.

Rotunda To Open About June First

The Ford Rotunda, Detroit's biggest tourist attraction and gateway to the famous Rouge plant, will reopen about June 1 as part of Ford Motor Company's 50th anniversary observance.

Thereafter, it will be open to the public for two days a week, including holidays, from 9:00 a.m. until 10:00 p.m.

With an accent on the future, artists, designers and architects have completely remodeled the 110-foot-tall gear-shaped structure which was built for the Chicago World's Fair in 1934 and later moved to its present location in Dearborn, Michigan.

Animated displays, sculptures, murals and exhibits in the air-conditioned building will tell the story of progress in the automotive industry — how science and manufacturing skills have been combined to produce a better way of life, and what they hold for the future.

The exhibits will portray the conversion of raw materials into finished products; the effect of industrial advancement on standards of living; the use of research and engineering in automotive production, and the potentialities of a modern industrial organization.

A renovated theater, with a seating capacity of 385 persons, will present film programs daily.

The W. B. Ford Design Corporation has developed a scale-model "city of the future" to show what life will be like in 1980 to come. Marshall Smith, who designed the sculpture, has fashioned 16 massive reliefs to depict the contribution of basic industries to the making of the automobile.

R. Buckminster Fuller, structural theorist and designer, has developed a geodesic dome that will cover the circular inner court of the Rotunda.

On the grounds, a half-mile roadway, which contains sections of different road surfaces that have been used with highway transportation over the world.

More than five million persons visited the Rotunda in Dearborn before World War II, when its display areas were converted to office space.

State Seeks Purchase Of Hunting, Fishing Sites

Purchase of 80 acres of hunting land, three fishing sites and 1,100 acres in addition to state game areas is recommended for conservation commission approval at its meeting in Lansing March 19 and 20.

Total cost of all the purchases would be about \$50,000.

The fishing sites include one on Lincoln Lake in Kent County, one on the Grand and Thornapple Rivers in Kent County, and one on Lakeview Lake in Kalamazoo County.

The hunting and game lands are scattered throughout the state. Factors to be considered for commission approval include consideration of boat and boat concessions, land exchanges and other routine items.
