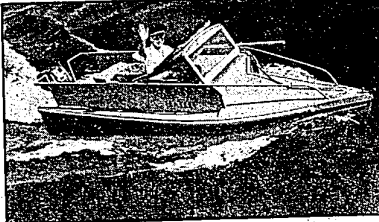

HOME ECONOMIST GIVES ADVICE ON RAINCOATS

April-shower weather requires a good raincoat, so a home economist at Michigan State College recommends you give a little thought to what kind of raincoat you buy.

Golden Winkler of the textile, clothing and related art department at MSC points out that there are two kinds of rain coats — water proof and water repellent. A waterproof coat protects against prolonged, heavy rain but it is non-porous and very hot to wear. Plastic or fabric coated with plastic or rubber are waterproof types.

Water repellent raincoats will protect against short exposure to showers, Miss Winkler advises. For most persons they are practical, because they are porous and comfortable. In buying a water repellent coat, check the label to see if it is durable to washing or dry cleaning or if the coat must be treated each time.

Look for a closely woven, smooth fabric because it will shed water better. Look, too, for a coat that has double fabric on the shoulders where rain hits hardest. Children's raincoats should be bright colored to show up on dark days, Miss Winkler urges. Easy-to-work buttons that close the coat high and low to keep out rain are an advantage. A hat or hood that is water-shedding is advisable.

Look for a conservative cut in a raincoat, Miss Winkler suggests. A raincoat that flaps in the wind, and drags on the floor of the bus or car is not practical. And get an amply cut raincoat so suits can be worn underneath comfortably.

Check Habits For Good Health

Tired most of the time? If this is the way you feel, Dorothy M. Greey, of the home management department at Michigan State College suggests taking stock of yourself and your work habits. You may have that tired-all-the-time feeling by simply rearranging the order of your work, she says.

But first of all, get a good check-up from your physician. If he gives you a clean bill of health, then take these pointers Miss Greey offers.

Do you get tired at a specific time of the day? Take a little time to relax then. Listen to the radio, or watch television, or spend the time with a good book or your hobby. Still better would be short rest periods interspersed throughout the day. Try lying down and relaxing completely for 10 or 15 minutes in mid-morning and mid-afternoon.

Is there a special activity that causes feelings of fatigue? If so, do that job piece-meal. If, for instance, you dread the ironing and get tired just thinking about it, arrange your work so you do the ironing for a short period of time over several days. And think about your method of doing a job that always makes you tired. As an example, is your ironing board too low? — perhaps you could eliminate that shoulder-ache by raising your work area several inches.

You may be making yourself tired, Miss Greey points out, by trying to accomplish too much. So-called fatigue can come from the tension and frustration of trying to get more done in a day than can be accomplished. Don't set your work goals too high and then you can enjoy the feeling that you have everything done at the end of the day.

Remove Old Paint For Floor Beauty

If your house was built 50 to 75 years ago, chances are you have been hiding the beauty of your floors with many coats of paint. Michigan State College home economists point out that the wide wooden boards that may have been painted over and over again can be beautiful if given a fair chance to be seen.

With proper refinishing a soft, dull finish can be achieved. And it is probable that you will find four floors are pine or oak.

The MSC specialists recommend that you experiment in out-of-the-way spots, like behind a door or in a closet. Clean off the finishes with a hand scraper — or perhaps a sanding machine will remove the old finish and give you smooth, attractive flooring.

After the floors have been sanded, you can get a satisfactory finish with a penetrating floor seal. This will not need rubbing and will not darken the floors. But frequent waxing may be needed. For day-to-day cleaning a dry mop and broom will do the trick. Rub steel heel marks lightly with a fine steel wool moistened with turpentine or liquid wax.
