The public cannot arrive in full measure until 1954, he noted.

The tax revision recommendations will require still further study. The Treasury Department, in which the Internal Revenue Bureau functions, is assembling a team of the top tax experts in the nation, and those already on the job have begun studies of various tax revision plans submitted by such organizations as the American Bar Association, the American Institute of Accountants, the Committee for Economic Development, the National Association of Manufacturers, and various other taxpayer groups. Similar studies are being conducted by the university research Joint Congressional Committee on Taxation.

The objective of these studies is to develop a tax system which will, as the President stated, impose the least possible burden on the dynamic growth of the country.

A Presidential Commission has been announced which will direct a long range study of the relation of the federal, state and local taxes. Besides federal officials and top-flight citizen-leaders, representatives of the state governments will probably be included in its membership. In fact, the most promising feature is the possibility of relinquishing to local governments some tax sources now monopolized by the federal government, as well as some services now rendered. This is a healthy goal; and it is encouraging to find it being talked about among the key people in our nation's capital.

New Equipment Speeds Surveys By State Lake Mapping Crews

Lake mapping operations may be hurried considerably through the use of two new and rather simple "sonic" sounding devices recently purchased by the conservation department.

The sounders record on dials and graphs the depth of water in lakes, from a few feet to a hundred fathoms or more.

Operated electrically, the sounders are easily attached to a rowboat and provide accurate information for lake mapping crews. Formerly, most lake mapping had to be done in the winter, when crews could walk on lake ice and take manual soundings by drilling holes in the ice. This made for slow, tedious work. A lake of 500 acres, for example, would take a crew of three men about five days to map, using the old methods.

Recently, using the new sounders, two men mapped a 500-acre lake in three days.

Though presently being checked in southern Michigan against proven lake maps, it is expected the sounders will be put to work on production basis before the summer has ended.

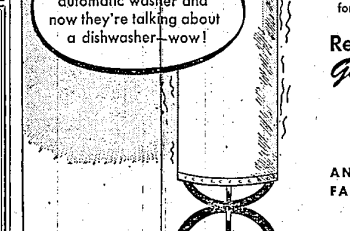
