chosen fields of endeavor. All these men have distinguished records of community and public service; and most important, I think, they are lifelong churchmen.

This same principle is followed at the secondary level as illustrated when President Eisenhower filled a vacancy on the highly important Civil Aeronautics Board. He appointed Col. Harman D. Denny, Jr., an outstanding authority on all phases of aviation and aviation commerce. Colonel Denny served on the Interstate Commerce Committee of Congress and was a member of its sub-committee which considered legislation affecting the CAB.

During the first World War he was a bomber pilot. In World War II, he was Air Inspector in the Graduate Command and General Staff School in Kansas. He was relied upon in Congress for his aviation know-how. Colonel Denny is one of the leaders of the Presbyterian Church; a member of the National Executive Board of the Boy Scouts of America; is an influential member of the American Legion, and several other nationwide service and fraternal organizations. He brings experience and integrity into public service — an inspiring combination.

MSC Golden Year Scheduled May 22

Another milestone in state service will be marked May 22 and 23 at Michigan State College when foresters and visitors gather to mark the 50th anniversary of the MSC department of forestry.

Tales from Paul Bunyan days and facts about forestry will be paraded in a May 22 program at the college and a May 23 field trip to the Kellogg Forest near Battle Creek.

Forestry was taught at East Lansing back in the 1880's as part of botany courses but in 1903 a separate department was set up with E. E. Bogue as the first forestry professor. Visitors will see the Bogue Forest Nursery named after him. They also will see the W. J. Beal Pinetum, started in 1896 by Beal, professor of botany. Also on campus and area tours will be the Tommy Virgin Woodlot, Rose Lake Wildlife Experiment Station and Hydrologic Installation, College Sawmill and Wood Utilization Laboratories.

By 1947, the MSC forestry department was second in the nation among the 29 forestry schools. In 1950, it was necessary to set up a new system, with a Conservation Division headed by Dr. Paul A. Herbert. He is a former head of forestry and the longest serving administrative head of any forestry school in the nation. This division includes the related departments of forestry, fisheries and wildlife, forest products and land and water conservation.

Speakers May 22 will include Prof. George A. Garratt of the Yale University School of Forestry, a 1920 MSC graduate, and Earl W. Tinker, executive secretary of American Pulp and Paper Association, New York City, a 1913 forestry graduate of MSC.

Look for socks made of the new helacel type nylon yarn. They come in small, medium and large sizes and are made of highly twisted yarn so they keep their shape, but do not bind. MSC home economists advise that the socks are colorfast and as easy to care for as regular nylon socks.

The conservation department is again asking that wildlife be given a wide berth this spring, that the land, forests and animals already busy with production, may proceed unmolested.
