

Largest Fires Reported in Southern Part Of State

During the last week 107 fires burned more than 1,300 acres of Michigan grass and forest land, nearly doubling the total of acres damaged thus far this year.

Until last week, the conservation department had reported about 1,400 acres damaged in 255 fires.

Most heavily hit were southeastern and southwestern Michigan. In the two areas, nearly 600 acres were damaged.

Following this opinion, the Commission has concluded that extension of the commercial facilities is essential if the shopping area is to provide for the additional population. Surveys are now being made by the Commission of available commercial property. Along with the expansion of the shopping area, facilities must be provided for off street parking. The City has already declared its intention to secure parking space on the east side of Farmington Road south of Grand River. Consideration is also being given to an amendment to the present zoning ordinance calling for required parking space on each piece of commercial property.

Based on figures compiled by the Detroit Metropolitan Area Regional Planning Commission, the City of Farmington will have a population of between 3,475 and 4,043 by 1960 and between 4,795 and 5,865 by 1970.

SET KINDERGARTEN REGISTRATION AT CLARENCEVILLE

Children in the Clarenceville School District who are eligible to attend kindergarten in September will be enrolled May 27 at the Central and Edgewood Schools.

MORE STRICT enforcement of the Township Health Ordinance was directed by the Board at its regular meeting last Tuesday evening. The Board authorized Tardy to proceed with the enforcement of the ordinance, including the inspection of unsanitary conditions, the notifying of persons to comply with the ordinance, and the recommendation of court action when necessary.

At the township meeting last Tuesday, Tardy mentioned several situations where sewage is being allowed to flow in open ditches. He also pointed out instances where outside toilets still exist, although the ordinance forbids them except on property owned as farms.

On May 5 the Brighton and Novi Methodist Church held their last quarterly meeting at Brighton with Dr. Frank Fitch, district superintendent, presiding.



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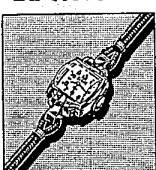

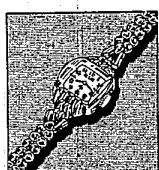


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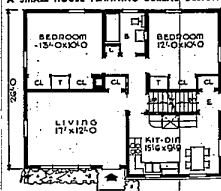
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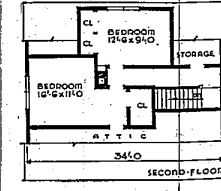
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IT WAS FUN!!!
