

**CONTINUE SURVEY OF SANITATION IN TOWNSHIP**

Township officials announced this week that work is progressing on the enforcement of the health ordinance and the elimination of unsanitary conditions in the area.

Thomas Tardy, sanitary and zoning inspector, stated that most residents are cooperating in correcting individual conditions. A survey of the township is continuing in an effort to enforce the existing ordinance. The county is cooperating with township officials in the survey.

In the meantime, A. G. Leonard, Township Attorney, is reviewing the present health ordinance in view of recommending certain changes. He is expected to have a report ready for the Board in the next few weeks.

Richardson stated that they will handle only those brands of known appliances and heating units which are the best in quality and service.

**Plan Expansion Of School Program**

Plans are now being developed on the expansion of the program of the Farmington Township School District in response to the approval by the voters of the millage increase.

An increase of 4.5 mills will be levied during 1953 and 2.5 mills will be levied from 1954 to 1956 inclusive for school operation. Superintendent O. S. Duncel stated that approval of the millage increase will allow the District to proceed in accordance with the present budget. If the proposal had been defeated, cutbacks in the planned program would have been necessary.

The superintendent reported that progress was being made in the securing of 16 additional teachers for the 1953-54 year. Details are also being completed on the expansion of the art, instrumental music, homemaking and industrial arts programs. Additional shop, pool music and homemaking teachers have been hired, as well as a second librarian.

With the completion of the new high school building, a separate junior and senior high school organization will be established. With a few exceptions, the junior high school program will be conducted in the present high school building. The senior high school will serve as principal of the junior and senior high schools with the assistance of Byron Oliver in the Junior high school and James Geller in the senior high school.

In discussing the proposed change of a portion of the Anhalt Hotel property from residential to commercial, a number of residents asked for a clarification of the proposed depth of the planned commercial area.

There was also considerable discussion on the amendment allowing the construction of multiple dwellings. Most of the opinions expressed at the meeting were in opposition to the amendment. Other amendments discussed were the proposals to allow the use of a trailer on farms for the owner or his employees and the depth of front yards in industrial and commercial zones as well as the requiring of fire proof construction on exterior walls of industrial buildings.
