Advise Safeguards For Polio Season

Common sense, not gamma globulin, will be every family's safeguard against polio this summer, the state health department says in urging parents to be on the alert as usual to guard their youngsters against the disease.

The polio "season" usually gets under way in Michigan about the middle of June and reaches its peak late in August. A few common-sense precautions will help to protect your youngsters during the coming weeks.

1. Don't get panicky. Remember that even though the number of cases of polio may be high, the number of persons paralyzed is usually low. Half of those who are diagnosed as having polio recover completely — most recover without being seriously handicapped.

2. Don't isolate your youngsters — let them play with their usual playmates, but don't let them mix with new groups.

3. Try to get the youngsters to rest or at least play quiet, sitting-down games part of the day. Don't let them swim to the point of becoming chilled, or to become chilled in any way. If they should have the polio virus in their bodies, being over-tired or chilled may result in more serious infection.

4. Keep the youngsters clean — be sure they wash their hands thoroughly before eating. Cleanliness is of utmost importance because polio may be transmitted through contaminated food and other contaminated substances, as well as through close personal contact with a carrier.

5. Consult your doctor at the first sign of illness, particularly if these symptoms appear: headache, fever, sore throat, upset stomach, stiff neck or back.

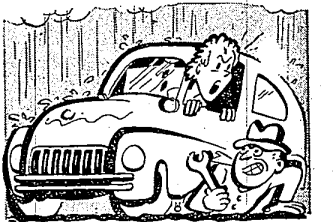

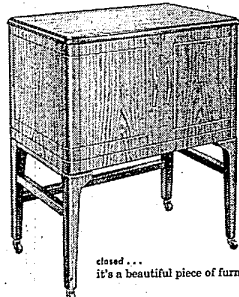

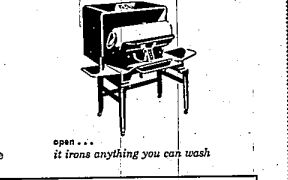
