State Authorizes Purchase Of Sites

The conservation commission authorized the purchase and lease of three fishing sites during its recent August meeting at Higgins Lake. About 650 acres of hunting and game lands were authorized for purchase as additions to 10 established state game areas with most funds to come from federal Pittman-Robertson monies. Subject to U. S. Forest Service approval, the commission also set aside 2,400 acres in Huron national forest for use in dog field trials. 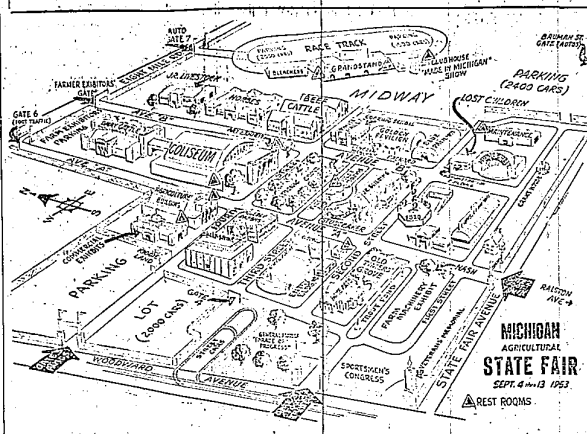
TROUT FISHING TO BE FEATURED AT STATE FAIR

The Michigan State Fair will feature "the world's biggest trout pond" during its ten day operation, September 1 through 13. For fifty cents you will be allowed to catch all the ten inch to twenty-inch wild trout you can pull in. With the blessings of the state department of conservation, the department of trout will be sent from the Crystal Spring trout-farms, Springport, Michigan, and will be placed in the 140 feet by 40 feet lagoon, used in former years as a decorative lake in the middle of the fairgrounds. A fifteen foot "shore" will encompass the lagoon. Yes, you can keep all the trout you catch. As a matter of fact, the State Fair will supply free freeze facilities where you can keep the fish until you leave the fairgrounds. And if you don't know how to cast for trout you can witness free daily casting demonstrations by various champions, including Jim Harbo. Proceeds from the fishing will go to the Y's Men Club of the Detroit Inland Yacht Club which uses the funds for its summer camp and recreation programs.

"I Was A Little Leaguer ..."

Ed. Note: Twenty-one year old Mark Lindenmuth, native of Williamsport, was a Little Leaguer in the days when there were but twelve leagues in the entire program. Remembered as one of the few boys ever to hit a ball over the dike which surrounds the Original Little League Field, he holds a trophy for scoring the highest batting average (.666) in 1914. Today, a member of the United States Marine Corps, he is a veteran of the Korean Conflict where he was wounded four times in action. The day I tried out for Little League Baseball was the biggest day of my life. "That was the day I started on the road to manhood when I decided to play in Little League. For me, it was the beginning of learning how to live. In Little League I was dejected — lots of times. Often I resigned the manager's orders. Time and again I struck out. But I never quit playing the game. I couldn't. I was part of a team. Little by little I learned the same, as Little League taught me to think in action. And as I played, my body grew healthy and strong. Before long, I was winning for my team. Then came the day I held a trophy in my hand. I was a champion. Now I am twenty-one and a Marine. But I like to think my basic training began way back there — when I was a Little Leaguer. And I tried my baseball exit for a Marine's uniform. I began think-
