FOIL SHOULD BE USED WITH CARE IN OVEN FOR SAFETY

proper use of foil for this purpose.

Use a piece of foil only slightly
larger than the pan or dish holding the food. Furn foil edges up
and place it on a rack directly
under the pan or dish.

Authorities auxion against covering the entire bottom of the
oven with foil because this cuts
off circulation of heat and prevents proper cooking.

off circulation of heat and prevents proper cooking.

Also, the heat given off by electric units or gas burners will be reflected back by the foll. This will overheat electric units, possibly; causing them to burn out. With gas burners, it will cause incomplete combistion of gas which requires air circulation to burn, properly.

Another precaution — toil should never touch open heat ing wires in any electric appliance because it is likely to cause a short circular.


