The Citizens' Committee meeting on a date set tentatively as October 20.

The water supply situation at Middlebelt School was reported as satisfactory but school officials are considering the possibility of entering into an agreement with Woodbine subdivision for connecting into their supply.

A motion was made and approved for the grading and seeding of the high school grounds as well as those for the Bond, Ten Mile and Middlebelt Schools. Officials are obtaining bids on the proposed work.

The Board voted to review fire insurance policies for the school district on October 1 on the basis of appraisal by a representative of the Hartford Casualty Company. In the meantime, appraisal quotations will be re-checked so that the School Board may again consider other appraisal services.

Northwestern and had just passed the Hinesco car when the accident occurred.

Hinesco's car was struck in the windshield by a loose tire which flew off the pick-up truck.

A veterinary ambulance also appeared on the scene to remove one of two dogs which were held transported in the pickup truck.

Former Farmington Mayor Del Hamlin was injured in an automobile accident on Middlebelt Road near Lone Pine Road on Wednesday, September 3.

The accident occurred at approximately 2:30 p.m. when Hamlin, driving south after attending a meeting in Pontiac, saw J. L. Hudson truck ahead which appeared to be parked. As Hamlin started to pass the truck, the driver made a left-hand turn in front of his car. Hamlin's car rebounded from the truck into a tree.

Both drivers were taken to a doctor by a passerby but State Police later removed them to Pontiac General Hospital.

Hamlin suffered a slight concussion and cuts to the head and legs. The truck driver received a dislocated shoulder.

The former mayor was released from the hospital the same day and has since been resting at home.

## Matches Planned For Dog Week

An American Kennel Club sanctioned All-Breed Match and Obedience Trial Match will be held by the Toledo Kennel Club on Sunday, September 24. It will take place in the Hobbs Building, Fort Miami Lucas County Fair Grounds on Key Street in Maumee, Ohio. This is just off the Anthony Wayne Trail, Route 24.

The event will celebrate the start of National Dog Week, which runs from September 20 to September 26 inclusive.

In addition to the judging of breed and obedience classes there will be special performances of obedience trained dogs at 2:00 p.m.

The All-Breed classes will be open to dogs of all ages from two months on up. Dogs having won points and champions are barred from competition as are the Utility Degree dogs from obedience competition. Puppy classes will be divided into four classes and Best Puppy will be selected of each breed.

Entries for the breed classes will be taken on the day of the match at 12:00 noon and up to judging time at 1:00 p.m.

The regular obedience classes are provided with the addition of graduate novice class for dogs having won a C. D. and graduate open class for dogs having won a C. D. X title. Obedience entries will be taken at 10:30 a.m. and the judging of obedience will start at 11:00 a.m.

The awards will be made by 12 outstanding judges among the various breeds. Best in Match will be judged by Hazel Liptak of Lincoln formerly a professional handler.

There will be rosettes for each Best of Breed and Best of Puppy of each breed, plus many trophies for the various classes. Obedience classes will also be covered by trophies.

Food will be served by the Toledo Kennel Club social committee throughout the day.

All pure-bred dog owners are invited to participate in the celebration of National Dog Week.

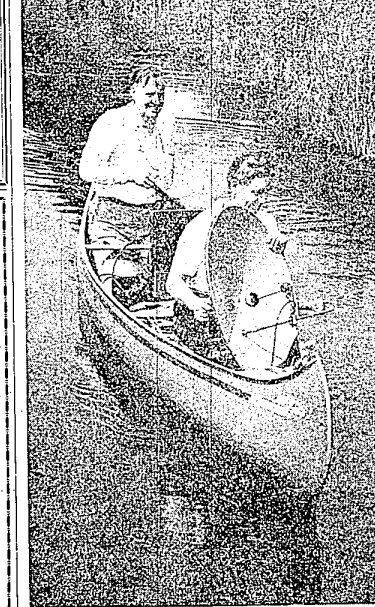
