

# Only 4 Say They'll Run At Schoolcraft

Schoolcraft College's trustee election is off to a slow start with just four persons publicly announcing their candidacies. Deadline for filing petitions to enter the race is 4 p.m. Monday, May 14.

Three trustees will be elected to six-year terms and one to a two-year term in the June 11 election.

Any resident of the Plymouth, Livonia, Garden City, Clarenceville or Northville School Districts may enter the race by getting petition signatures of at least 50 registered voters from the college district.

Petitions are available from school administration offices in each school district and from the college's administration offices. The college is located at 18600 Hagerly, Livonia.

Observer newspapers have published candidate announcements for Paul Kadish and Mrs. Nancie Blatt, both of Livonia, for the six-year terms. Ron Cowden and Mark McQueen, also both of Livonia, have also announced for two-year terms.

Ten persons are known to have taken out petitions. Kadish is currently serving an elected term on the board and Mrs. Blatt was appointed to the board in January.

This campaign may be mild with no really divisive issues emerging at this time. The college's building priorities will be discussed by trustees in the next month and could become an election issue.

Opponents of the mandatory provision generally claim it would be difficult to enforce and infringe on the rights of individuals.

Proponents argued that an accident victim is 30 times more likely to be killed if thrown from the car and that failure to use safety belts increases the risk of instant death or severe injury by at least 100 per cent and of less severe injury by at least 40 per cent.

Sens. David Plawewski (D-DeARBorn Heights) and William Faust (D-Westland) voted for the bill while Sens. Carl Pursell (R-Plymouth) and Daniel Cooper (D-Oak Park) voted against it.

# Aptekar Speaks At Orchard Ridge

Dr. Herbert Aptekar, director of the Institute for Marxist Studies in New York City, will be the keynote speaker at a teach-in on John Brown and the abolitionist movement today (Wednesday) on the Orchard Ridge campus of Oakland Community College.

The teach-in will run from 2 until 9 p.m., on the Farmington campus, 1498 and Orchard Lake Rd.

Sponsored by the North-west Inter-Faith Center for Racial Justice, the session will include presentations by local speakers.

Topics include "The Role of Southeastern Michigan in Anti-Slavery," "Women: Anti-Slavery and Racial Justice," "The Share-Cropping South versus the Industrial North" and "Religious Involvement in the Abolitionist Movement."

Dr. Aptekar will talk on "John Brown: His Relevance Today" at 4:15 p.m. in "J" Building. Rooms will be available at registration beginning at 2 p.m.

Dr. Aptekar has written several books on the anti-slavery movement. The teach-in is designed to re-examine abolitionist John Brown's role in history.

The EMT training program is a community project designed to upgrade the quality of emergency medical care services.

Instruction is provided by a cross-section of health care professionals over a period of 13 months.

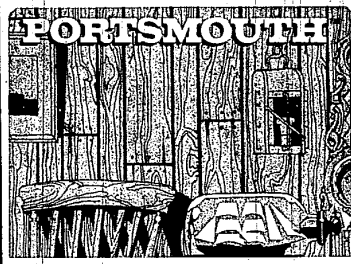

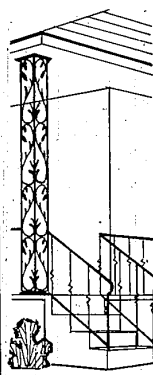
