

5 Teenagers Killed In Crash

FARMINGTON A lark at Kensington Park ended in tragedy when a car filled with seven Detroit teenagers hit a crane parked on I-696 near Middle Belt Road in Farmington Township Saturday, killing five of the occupants.

The five who died were Kenneth R. Callahan, 17, Ronald L. Smith, 18, Karen Trahey, 16, Katherine Howard, 17, and Veryl Mitchell, 19.

FARMINGTON Rodolfo Bruni, Farmington graduate recently from the Walsh College of Accountancy and Business Administration.

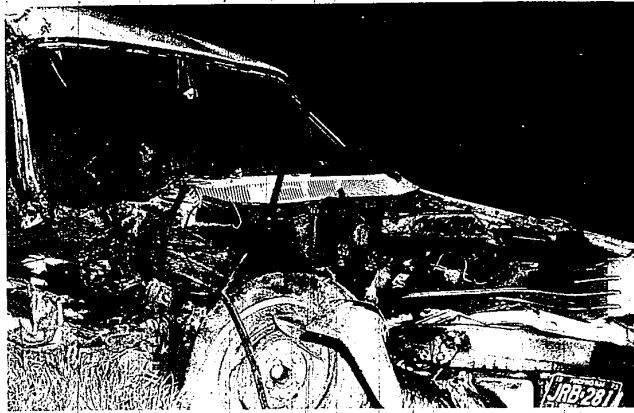
Anthony Lyons, 17, and Pablo Martinez, 16, were taken to Botsford General Hospital, listed in serious condition.

Lyons was the driver of the car, according to Farmington Township police reports.

Witnesses told police the car appeared to be going at a high rate of speed when it went out of control and hit the crane.

The impact sheared off the right-hand side of the car, which slid several hundred feet further down the road before ending up in the median of the expressway.

The teenagers were apparently returning from Kensington Park when the accident occurred.

City Sidewalks Can Be Fixed

FARMINGTON Farmington residents who wish to have their sidewalks replaced can do so through the city at a "very competitive price."

City Manager Robert F. Deadman said that through competitive bidding, the city has found a contractor who will remove and replace a four-inch walk for 80 cents a square foot. A six-inch walk can be removed and replaced for 90 cents a square foot.

"The city has received several requests from persons

residing outside this year's sidewalk replacement program area to have the city replace their sidewalks this summer," Deadman said.

"We believe that we can make this replacement program available to any property owners in Farmington on a voluntary basis if they will notify us that they wish to have the work done."

He added this offer is available to all city residents. "All that is needed is to contact me," Deadman said.
