BOAR SHOW, SALE SLATED FOR NOVEMBER

A unique event, the first of its kind in the United States, will be staged by the Michigan Swine Breeders' Association at Michigan State College on November 2.

The breeders call it their first annual Boar Exhibit, Show and Sale. The event gives breeders an opportunity to display their sires, to establish themselves as breeders of fine stock, and gives hog raisers a chance to look over a large group of animals before buying a sire.

The boars brought in for exhibit will be divided into these classifications: choice, select, good, medium but acceptable, poor and undesirable. They will be grouped by a competent, out-of-state judge.

A champion and reserve champion will be selected for each breed among the choice, select and good. Each exhibitor will establish his own price on his boars and will sell them himself.

Each exhibitor is eligible to exhibit two spring boars. The animal must be registered or eligible for registry.

Harry F. Moxley, extension animal husbandman at MSC and secretary of the breeders' association, is in charge of the event.

Dramatize New Methods At Show In Chicago

Oakland Dairy Exhibitors To Show Prize Herd At Chicago October 10

Oakland County dairy exhibitors will be represented at the first International Dairy Show to be held in Chicago October 10 to 17, show officials announced recently.

Windrow Farms, owned by C. E. and E. E. Wilson, of Birmingham, will bring a purebred Ayrshire show herd of 12 animals to compete for top honors in the contests of this breed at the new national dairy show.

Other Oakland County entries include Paul E. Findel of Oxford, in the Jersey competitions, and Lakeland Farms and J. W. Gilbert, of Clarkston, have listed entries in the Holstein classes.

The big dairy show which is attracting exhibition herds from the continent's top breeders will be held in the International Amphitheatre, site of last year's national political conventions, and home of the 53 year old International Live Stock Exposition, under whose management the Dairy Show will also be conducted.

Color, excitement and romance of the old West will return to Chicago's International Amphitheatre when one of the nation's top rodeos will be held in conjunction with the Dairy Show as an evening entertainment feature during the eight-day run of the show.

The management reports that the rodeo has been approved for the Rodeo Cowboys Association of Denver. They will compete for \$17,000 in cash prizes in five events: saddle bronco riding, calf roping, steer wrestling and Brahman bull riding.

Protect Soil With Corn Stalks

The soil that grows Michigan's most important crop — corn — is worth saving. Corn stalks left in fields over winter will help, advises Frank W. Trull, Michigan State College extension soil conservationist.

Crop residues — broken corn stalks, spread-out soybean straw, or similar mulches — help the soil to absorb the pounding of rain just as growing crops do, he explains. In fact falling corn stalks have the potential to plow 10 times the area on which it falls if its force is not broken, says Trull, and this starts the washing-away of soil.

Trull cites an experiment with two plots on a 4 per cent slope at Illinois Agricultural Experiment Station. A rainfall of nearly two inches in an hour took 193 pounds of soil off an acre where corn stalks were broken down across the slope. In an adjoining bare plot, the rain took 4,148 pounds of soil — or 20 times as much — from one acre. In a soybean straw test, the covered acre lost 715 pounds and the bare acre 3,362 pounds of soil.

GRAND RAPIDS IS SITE OF TURKEY FETE

The annual Michigan Turkey Festival will feature five divisions with 31 classes this year when the event opens at Grand Rapids on November 3. The turkey exhibition and educational program runs through November 5.

Marve DeWitt of Zeeland, president of the Michigan Turkey Growers' Association, is chairman of the festival. Michigan State College's poultry department cooperates in staging the show and program. Extension poultryman Don Miller is secretary-treasurer of the association.

Besides the exhibit competition, the show will feature prominent speakers in the turkey raising business. A panel discussion on the first day will present ideas on "What Makes a Good Poultry" Howard Zindel of MSC will be moderator. Participants will include Lester Soules of Jackson, Marshall Michaels of Alma and Marve DeWitt.

Other speakers will include Cliff Carpenter, Chicago, president of the Institute of American Poultry Industries; Dr. Benjamin Pomeroy, professor of veterinary medicine at the University of Minnesota; Anne B. Ryan, a home economist from Detroit; and D. B. (Woody) Varner, director of Michigan State College's Cooperative Extension Service. Turkey diseases and ways to cook different sized birds will be featured in discussions and demonstrations.
