### PLAN MEMORIAL TO DR. MACKENZIE AT MONDAY MEETING

A meeting dedicated to the memory of the late Dr. O. W. MacKenzie was held at the Walled Lake High School gymnasium on Monday, October 12, at 8:00 p.m. for the purpose of erecting a useful and lasting memorial to the beloved physician.

Principal speaker for the occasion was Rev. O. A. Gieseler of St. Matthew's Lutheran Church and other parts of the program featured the High School Girls' Chorus under the direction of Mrs. Ronald Lamontagne.

If enough popular support is forthcoming, a clinic or small hospital may be erected to the memory of the good doctor.

Dr. MacKenzie served as a faithful physician in western Oakland County for some 15 years. Although his office and practice centered around Walled Lake, many people from the surrounding areas turned to him in sickness and trouble. They found both a friend and a sympathetic and skillful doctor.

He was well-known and respected in medical circles. Because of his ability, initiative and leadership, he was chosen to serve important posts in the Oakland County Medical Association. Dr. MacKenzie was a man of vision. As a doctor, his primary concern was the health and the physical care of men, women and children of this expanding metropolitan area. He knew that this section needs more adequate medical care, and therefore had planned to build a clinic to serve this ever-growing region.

Those plans were shattered by his sudden and tragic death.
