Fresh Broccoli

When buying fresh broccoll, look for stalks that are firm and green. The heads should have tight buds and be a rich green or slightly burplish green color.

Broccoll should be washed thoroughly under running water or by plunging the heads up and down in cold water. Tim off the tough stalk ends and drop into rapidly boiling salted water.

Cook just until stalks are fork tender, but still firm—12 to 15 minutes. Some people like to stand the stalks, blossome end up, in the water and cook about 8 to 10 minutes.

Lay the blossoms down in the water and continue cooking until tender. This is because the stalks take longer to cook than the blossoms. Serve with buiter.


