Warn Children Of Hunt Danger

Now that hunters are taking their runs out of locked closets, the next three months may well be termed "open season on children." While all hunting accidents are needless, the maiming and killing of children as a result of the sport is particularly tragic.

An estimated total of 9,300 shooting mishaps will occur this year. About three-fifths of these deaths and injuries will occur in the field or public places, while the remaining two-fifths will happen because of carelessness with guns in or around the home.

When Dad cleans his gun, make sure the children are not present. Finally, never allow a child under the age of 14 to accompany a hunter on a trip.

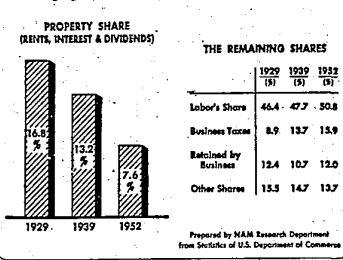

GM Fire Causes Roofers To Seek New Materials

Fire Chief Makes Roofing Study

Many of the nation's roofing manufacturers have studied the results of a fireproofing materials as a result of information provided by Livonia's Fire Chief Calvin Roberts after his analysis of the General Motors transmission plant fire.

Chief Roberts' report showed that tar and asphalt roofing was the major cause for the spread of the blaze that destroyed the GM plant last August.

"The manufacturers haven't found the answer yet, but we showed them the present roofing materials constitute a definite fire hazard," Roberts said.

The Ford property was conducted by the roofing of five plants now under construction, waiting for roofing manufacturers to develop a fire-proof adhesive to replace tar and asphalt.

During the GM blaze, Roberts and Director of Public Safety James Hagen noticed that the fire seemed to be spreading along the roof more rapidly than at floor level.

Since the fire, Roberts and Hagen have been approached by dozens of industrial construction firms and fire officials who were puzzled by the rapid spread of the blaze.

"We reduced it to simple phrases for the industrialists and roofing manufacturers," Roberts said.

"When we showed that almost 3 1/2 million pounds of tar and asphalt were consumed in the fire, the manufacturers were convinced. Now they're at work developing fire-resistant materials," Roberts said.

Parents must not relax vigilance in having their children protected against certain diseases. Dr. Joseph Molner, Detroit commissioner of health, advised that three cases of tetanus have been reported to the Detroit Department of Health since the beginning of the year: a 29 year old woman and two boys, 10 and 14 years old.

Tetanus or lockjaw is one of the serious diseases for which there is protective treatment which should be given when the child is three months old, a booster treatment at three years, again before entering school and every five years thereafter.
