


Congratulations To New Captain

In Summary: Clarenceville Trojans Complete Best Season In Last Six Campaigns

The Clarenceville Trojans have just ended the best season they have had in six years. The 1953 Trojans finished in third place in the Wayne - Oakland County League with three wins, two losses and one tie in league competition. In non-league games the Trojans won one game and tied another.

Clarenceville started off the season rather slowly as they tied two games and lost one before going into the winner's circle. The season started as the Trojans traveled to Farmington to play their traditional rivals, the Farmington Falcons. The game ended in a scoreless tie, but it was still a moral victory for the Trojans. This was the first time since 1949 that the Trojans saw a battle and the game ended with the Falcons didn't beat them. Clarenceville had threatened several times during the game but could not get across the goal.

In the second game of the season, the Trojans played host to the Detroit Indians on local gridiron. This was the first league test for the Trojans. The first half of the game produced two Trojans scores but both were called back because of penalties. The Trojans made the extra point on the same play and the game ended with the score tied 7-7.

The following week the Trojans had an open date, but on Friday, October 9, the Trojans played their second league game of the season and lost it to Northville 20-19. After several punts Clarenceville took over on the 45 yard line and promptly marched down the field for a touchdown. Glenn Reed crashed over from the one on a quarterback sneak. Northville made one score in the remaining minutes of the first period and in the second period tied at half-time 13-6.

In the final period, however, the Trojans caught fire and scored two quick touchdowns to take the lead 19-13. Then with 20 seconds left in the game, the Mustangs clicked on a pass for the touchdown. For the all-important extra point the Mustangs gave a kick and ran it over to win the game 20-19.

Still searching for their first victory the Trojans traveled to Clarkston and handed them a 25-0 defeat. The scoring started in the second period when Glenn Reed fired a pass to end Dick Godette in the end zone. There was no more scoring until the final period as the Trojans scored three touchdowns to none for Clarkston. The first, fully came on a two yard sneak by quarterback Glen Reed. Glenn Gilmore's placement was good and Clarenceville led 13-0. Midway in the period Gilmore pitched a pass to Ray Robbins for the third Trojan marker. The last touchdown came after Clarkston had driven to the Trojan 24 yard line, and Robbins intercepted a pass on the 15 and ran 85 yards to put the game on ice.

With the taste of victory still in their mouths, the Trojans upset Holly 13-0 in their annual Homecoming game. This victory is a tribute to the Trojan defensive line, as they held Holly to two first downs during the whole game and frequently pushed them back for large losses. The touchdowns didn't come until the last period when Bill Myers, on a four yard sneak, and Gilmore's extra point was good, gave the Trojans a 7-0 lead. Then on the last play of the game, the Holly quarterback tried to complete a long pass, but this proved fatal as Tom Rutilla intercepted it and interlarded to Myers who went over for the score.

The Trojans won their third straight game as they defeated highly-favored Inkster - Roosevelt in a non-league tilt. Roosevelt had previously been undefeated in six starts and led the Metro-Spawburgh League. The lone touchdown of the game came on the second Trojan play as Robbins ran off tackle for 68 yards, and the score. Gilmore's placement was good and Clarenceville led 7-0. Coach Nick Ianni of Clarenceville has selected 18 boys as football letter winners. Included in the 18 are ten seniors, five juniors and three sophomores. The three sophomores who received letters were Bruce Moore, center; Nelson Todd, end; and Larry Dailig, tackle. The juniors were Glen Reed and Don Douglas, quarterbacks; Bob Snell, halfback; Bob Gross, tackle, and Dick Godette, end. The senior letter winners include co-captain Tom Rutilla, guard; co-captain Bill Myers, halfback; Jim Galloway, guard; Mel Koch, tackle; Gene Childress and Dick Wood, ends; Pat Killen and Larry Tucker, ends; Clay Robinson, halfback; and Ed Gilmore, a fullback on the team.

The team elected Bob Gross to be next year's captain and Jim Galloway edged Clay Robinson out by one vote for the most valuable player of the 1953 season.

There were also three boys who made the Wayne - Oakland County League All-Star team. They are Tom Rutilla, Mel Koch and Clay Robinson.

The 1953 Trojans had the best Clarenceville record in six years with four wins, two losses and two ties. They also took third place in the League, as they compiled 145 points to the opponents' 47 points. The scoring was divided between seven boys with Bill Myers and Clay Robbins leading the pack with 30 points, scoring five touchdowns each. Ed Gilmore was second with 17 points. Glen Reed was right behind Gilmore with 12 points, and Pat Killen, Dick Godette and Larry Tucker scored one touchdown each. M. K.

State, regional and local leaders in winter sports promotion will participate in the conference. They will seek means of expanding and improving the state's winter sports program, to maintain Michigan's favorable position as a winter playground.

The conference agenda covers all aspects of Michigan's winter sports program: improvement, expansion and promotion of present winter sports areas; development of new centers; transportation facilities for the winter tourist; and the impact of winter sports on the state, region and local community.

Perez, Gallardo To Fight Nov. 27

Larupin Lulu Perez and fast-punching Dave Gallardo will try it again in Madison Square Garden Friday night, November 27, in a ten round featherweight scrap to be nationally televised and broadcast on the Cavalcade of Sports.

The fight will start at 10:00 p.m. Eastern Standard Time and will be seen on the NBC television network and heard over the ABC radio network.

When these two boys opened the Garden fight season in September, they were eight fast and furious rounds before Perez was awarded a TKO when Gallardo suffered a deep cut over the eye. Perez, a heavy favorite going into the fight, ran into a tangle in Gallardo, and many TV fans and sportswriters had been ahead on the fight when the fight was stopped.

Since then, Perez has fought once, knocking out Joey Cam in 48 seconds of the eighth round. Gallardo has been waiting for his eye to heal before taking another shot at Perez.

Perez, looking forward to a crack at Willie Pep, has won 23 straight, with 19 of his victories being by the knockout route. In all he has won 32, dropping only one fight.

Gallardo, featherweight champ of California, at 23 years of age is much more experienced than his opponent, three years younger. Dave has had 64 fights with 45 wins, 15 losses and four draws. He has knocked out eight opponents. In boxing circles, this remark is known as a "natural".

State Heralds New Hunt Tags

Hunters and license dealers alike have hailed Michigan's 1953 hunting license as more convenient and more compact than bulky licenses of the past.

The new license is printed on light, half-sized paper, instead of the post card size and weight of previous years.

The bulky Game Report Card has also been removed from the body of the license proper, and while all hunters are still required to fill out and return the cards, they now need not be carried along with the license.

Bookkeeping is also made easier. Under the new system, the license dealer only fills out one (triplicate form instead of two single forms, as in the past. The hunter keeps the original, the department gets No. 2 copy and the license dealer keeps the third copy for his files. It's also expected that license violators are going to have a tougher time getting past this system than they have in the past.

Hunters may paste the duck stamp on the reverse side of the new license; formerly, space was left on the face of the license for that stamp, but it was crowded to the reverse side under the new system.




