FALCON VARSITY BOWLS TO BENTLEY IN FIRST GAME

The Farmington Falcons lost a hard fought game to the Bentley Bulldogs last Friday night, 45 - 41. Bill King, sparkplug of the Bentley squad, scored 20 points to lead the scoring for Bentley while John McCaffrey, Falcon center, paced Farmington's attack with 12 points.

Wayne Dryden, Falcon captain, scored the first two points of the season on a "set" shot from out in back. Jerry Rice and McCaffrey followed with four points each and John Fawcett contributed two as Farmington jumped off to a 13 - 3 lead in the first quarter.

Bill King and Ron Cole dropped in nine and six points respectively, as Bentley put on a 15-point surge in the second period to lead Farmington at half time 23 - 11. Chuck Maki led Farmington's attack in this quarter with four points while McCaffrey and Fawcett each put two.

Farmington and Bentley played a basket for basket game in the third quarter with each team scoring ten points. McCaffrey led Farmington's assault with six points while Dryden and Rice each sank two. Algonid, Bentley guard, threw in four points to lead the Bulldogs offensive.

Bentley outscored Farmington 12 - 10 in the final period. The Falcons committed six fouls in the final four minutes with Bentley capitalizing on five of them.

This 45 - 41 score shows an improvement over the last game Farmington played with Bentley when Farmington met the Bulldogs in the "2-2" tournament, the score ending 70 - 48 in favor of Bentley.

The Farmington starting lineup was McCaffrey, center; Rice and Dryden, forwards; and Maki and Jim Hewshaker, guards.

Again in the fourth quarter the Trojans took the lead but the Lions came from behind with five points in the last two minutes to win the game 39 - 26.

High point men for the Trojans were Pat Killen and Tom Rutla with 12 points each. Rutla's tallies came on six field goals while Killen's came on three field goals and six foul shots.

Next Friday, December 11, the Trojans will open their league schedule when they travel to Keego Harbor to play Roosevelt High School at 8:00 p.m.

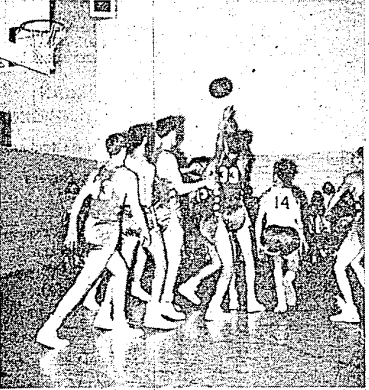
