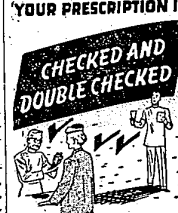
The regular meeting of the Leaders Club will not be held in December and in its place there will be a Christmas party.

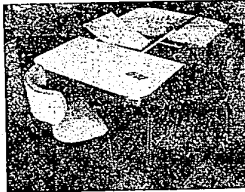

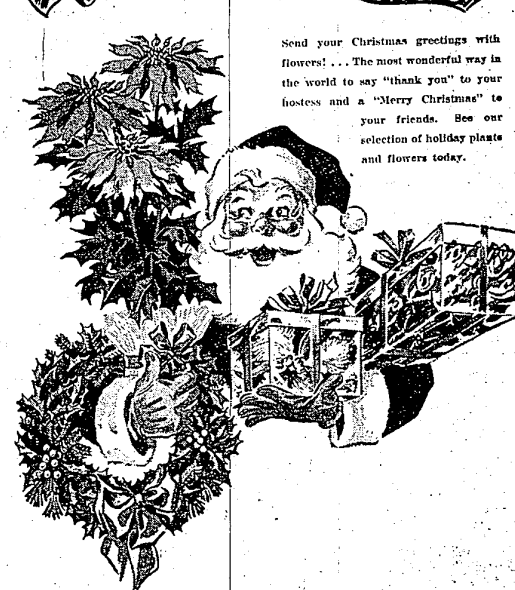
