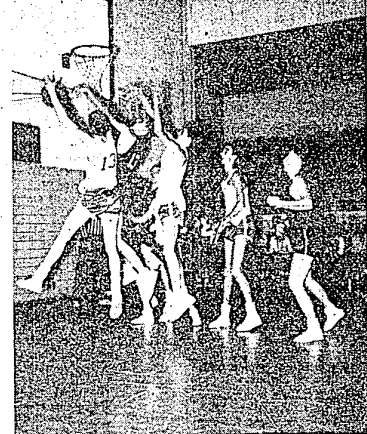

Merians Paces Team With 13 Tallies

The Clarenceville Trojans lost their fourth basketball game of the current season to the Brighton Bulldogs last Friday, December 18, in a hard-fought contest.

The game started slowly as Brighton took a 7-5 first period lead on five free throws and one field goal, while the Trojans posted two field goals and a gift shot.

In the second stanza the Trojans battled back to take an 18-16 lead at half-time. The Trojans were paced by Pat Killeen and Jim Merians with 5 and 4 points, respectively.

The third period proved to be the difference as the Bulldogs outshot the Trojans 15-6 to take a 31-24 third period lead.

In the final frame, however, the Trojan Five battled back to win in two points of the Bulldogs, but could not quite catch them. The Trojan were kept in the game by Jim Merians and Bill Myers. Merians held the tall Brighton center scoreless in the final period while hitting for six points on two field goals and a pair of foul shots. Myers was a constant threat on defense in the final period as he stole the ball on three different occasions and scored on the fast break twice and was fouled the other time.

The foul shots proved to be the difference as the Trojans hit for 15 field goals but made only 6 of 17 free throws for 28 points while the Bulldogs hit on only 13 field goals but scored on 14 out of 24 free throws for 40 points.

High point man for the game was Max Southwell of Brighton with 11 points. Jim Merians led the Trojans with 13 tallies.

The Farmington Falcons beat the Berkley Bears last Friday night, 47-39. John McCaffrey led the Farmington attack with 14 points.

Both teams got off to a slow start in the first period as the Falcons took a 7-4 lead. Chuck Maki paced the way with four points while Jim Livschaker got two and Jerry Rice one.

Berkley poured in 17 points and held Farmington to 11 as the Bears took a 22-18 lead at half-time. Six foot seven Dick Radotz led the Berkley scoring for the first half with eight points.

Farmington narrowed Berkley's four point lead to two points in the third quarter by hitting fifteen points while holding the Bears to thirteen. McCaffrey got six points to lead the assault. Rick Maki and Ron Donoghue each scored three.

Trailing by two points, 35-33, going into the last quarter, the Falcons held Berkley to four points while scoring fourteen. Donoghue scored eight of those fourteen points. Wayne Dryden, McCaffrey and Rice each made two. They scored 17 out of 23 foul shots on Friday night against Berkley.

The Berkley game marked the fourth game in a row that Farmington has won since losing the opening game of the season to Bentley, 45-51. The Falcons now boast a season record of four wins and one loss and a league record of two victories and no defeats. Farmington will not play again until January 8 when they take on the Walled Lake Vikings in a game that will see the winning team take sole possession of first place in the Inter-Lakes League. Both teams have a 2-0 League record.
