### Moderate Weather Good For Deer

The conservation department's "yarding" report of the season indicated that Michigan's deer herd was still a long way from its winter quarters last week.

Deer concentrate in deer yards generally last winter months during severe winter months to protection against storms. Generally, once concentrated in these areas, they remain until spring.

In the upper peninsula last week, snow depths ranged from about a foot along the Lake Superior shore to mere traces in the southern part of the peninsula.

Deer were drifting into the vicinity of yards in the heavier snow areas, but for the most part were still scattered over most of their range. Weather had been moderate for this time of year, with temperatures ranging from 0 to 40 degrees.

In the lower peninsula, there was no evidence of yarding at any point, with the heat ranging freely over its entire range.

Generally mild weather with variable amounts of snow was reported, and conditions for this time of year were described as mild.

### SCHOOLS STUDY THREE-OFFICIAL COURT GAMES

If two officials blow more whistles than many fans believe necessary in basketball, adding a third man in a striped shirt would appear likely to result in the call of even more fouls. But, The Sporting News reports, experiments by the Big Ten Conference with three-man officiating crews have indicated that just the opposite is true.

During the 1952-53 season, when two officials worked all Big Ten games, there was an average of 44 personal fouls per game. However, in two experimental games, this year — Iowa vs. Washington (St. Louis) and Illinois vs. Butler — the average with three-man crews was only 40 fouls.

These figures are just one of the talking points in favor of three officials," according to Bill Macleod, the Big Ten's supervisor of basketball officials under Commissioner Tug Wilson.

"The main point that impressed me," he said in The Sporting News story, "is the complete coverage of the floor by a three-man crew. There isn't a single blind spot any time. There always is at least one official with a clear view of every play and guesswork is entirely eliminated."

Bill Gullion of Washington U., after watching the work of three officials in his team's contest with Iowa, said, "This is the most progressive step in basketball officiating in the game's history."

### Top Middleweights To Fight Friday

Joe Giardello, third-ranked middleweight, looking for a shot at Champion Bobo Olson, battles with rugged Gary Panter in a top flight ten rounder to be nationally telecast and broadcast from Madison Square Garden Friday night, January 8, on the Cavalcade of Sports.

The fight, with every promise of a thriller, will start at 10:00 p.m. EST and be seen over the full NBC television network and heard on the ABC radio network.

Giardello, a flashy fighter from Philadelphia, has fought his way to his third ranking position with victories over such outstanding fighters as Ernie Durando, Billy Graham, Pierre Langlois and Joey Giambra. His record shows 61 fights with 45 wins, 11 losses, five draws and 14 kayos.

Joey's a smooth working fighter who recently upset Vince Martiano.

Panter, considered one of the best fighters to come out of the Northwest in years, has a long string of knockouts to his credit. Only 22 years of age, the rugged professional fighter, has had 62 professional fights. He has won 52 of them, 35 by the knockout route, while losing 12 times and drawing once.
