Here is the data on the big stage show which will be presented twice daily during the 41st annual Detroit Automobile Show, February 20 through 25, at the Michigan State Fair Grounds.

Joni James, currently rated the No. 1 girl singer in the nation, will head a two hour all-star show in the coliseum at 3:00 p.m. and 8:30 p.m. every day. The stage show will be included for the price of admission to the entire auto show, which will be open daily from 11:00 a.m. to 11:00 p.m.

In addition to Joni James, the featured entertainers—all on the same show—are: Ben Cornall, Louis Jordan, the Harmonicats, The Step Brothers, the Beachcombers, Roy Tracy, and Herschel Leiby's 17-piece orchestra.

Don Ridler, famed for his stage productions at the Michigan State Fair, Lawrence Tech and elsewhere, arranged the auto show stage program.

It will be the 41st annual auto show, the first in Detroit in 12 years, sponsored by more than 300 members of the Detroit Automobile Dealers Association.

M. T. (Pat) Patterson, auto show chairman, whose goal is to establish Detroit as the nation's No. 1 city in auto shows, will see auto production, says this edition of the Detroit Auto Show will be the biggest and most dramatic ever presented in Detroit.
