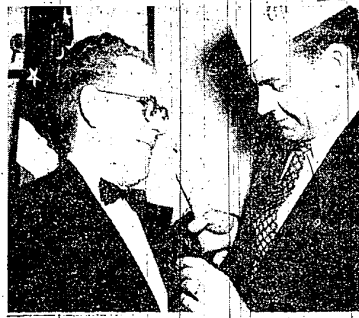
Obituary

U-M Institute Studies Local Governments

Thorough investigation of local government useful to members of government, high school students of civics, and the interested voter has recently been completed and made available to the public by the University of Michigan Institute of Public Administration.

The city governments include three types - mayor, commission and manager - while the townships are divided into two classifications - rural and urban.

RESOLUTION

Resolution to amend the Zoning Ordinance for the Township of Farmington, Oakland County, Michigan.
At regular meeting of the Farmington Township Board held March 23, 1954, a resolution was passed that the Township Board of Farmington Township, Oakland County, Michigan, hereby declares its intent to amend the Zoning Ordinance of Farmington Township in the following manner: That all the following described property in Farmington Township now zoned R1 and Light Industrial be rezoned to completely Light Industrial:
Lots in the Township of Farmington Oakland County, Michigan, Section 26, Town 1 North, Range 3 East, described as a parcel of land being all of the West half of the southeast quarter of said Section 26, lying south of the southerly line of Shawassaw Road, extending therefrom a parcel designated as beginning at an iron pin set at the quarter corner common to Sections 26 and 25 of said Township; thence north 0 degrees 18 minutes east 54 feet to a point; thence south 89 degrees 40 minutes east 1312.01 feet to a point; thence south 0 degrees 20 minutes west 55 feet to a point; thence north 89 degrees 30 minutes west 1312.0 feet along section line common to Section 26 and 35 to point of beginning.
and that the same be published in the Farmington Enterprise within 10 days from date hereof, and that it be further resolved that the clerk of the Township Board of Farmington Township is hereby authorized to submit a copy of this resolution to the Township Zoning Board of Farmington Township for its recommendation.
The resolution was adopted.
