to you? It could stand for many things - profits losses, increases or decreases. But to at least on Farmington citizen it means a small minority vote on election day.

on election day.

That 14% was the ratio of actual voters to the number of qualified electors who participated in the special Farmington Township School District election last Monday. The one Farmington citizen we refer to called us to express her concern regarding the low percentage vote. She suggested that legislation should be enacted establishing a minimum vote requirement. We share her concern over the comparatively small number of citizens who voted in the school election. The final result might have been more encouraging had the weather been different. But this is hardly an excuse where our schools ond our democratic processes are concerned. Certainly more than 14% of the registered voters could have gotten to the polls if they had really wanted to. But they either forgot, or they just didn't care.

In a democracy we can not and should not force

In a democracy we can not and should not force citizens to vote, any more than we can or should force persons to vote a certain way. Our strength as free people comes from individual responsibility. There are dangers in our present system. Minority decisions are not healthy to our democratic way of life, but they must be eliminated by individual action, not restrictive legislation.

The Enterprise endorsed the proposed school building program and we are pleased that it passed it. but we are far from satisfied with the degree of participation. Many people throughout the world have lost their freedom because they forgot that it is more than a right and a privilege . . . it's an individual
