Wayne Dryden, Farmington southpaw, turned in a neat three-hitter last Friday as the Falcons took Walled Lake 7-0 for their first victory in two starts.

Dryden did not allow a hit until the fifth inning, struck out 8 and walked only one.

Farmington scored 7 runs on 9 hits and made no errors while Walled Lake had no runs on 3 hits and made 5 errors.

Don Robinson got the first hit of the game in the second inning, but he died on first as the next three batters went out in order.

The Falcons scored their first run in the third when Dryden took first on the catcher's error, went to third on Maki's single, and scored when the second baseman threw West's grounder away.

In the fourth frame the Falcons added three more runs when Dryden scored Rockefeller on a sacrifice fly, and West came through with a bases-loaded single to score Alexander and Jones.

Farmington added insurance in the fifth when Jerry Dynda doubled and Rockefeller singled him to third. When Rockefeller stole second, Dynda scored on the second sacker's error.

In the Vicking half of the inning, Burmeister, the catcher, singled for the first hit of the day off Dryden. Tuson then walked, and was promptly erased when Rockefeller snagged Brown's liner in right, and threw to Jones for the double play. Woolley struck out to end the inning.

The Falcons failed to score in the sixth inning and Wilkinson of the Walled Lake pitcher, singled to left for the Vikings' second hit.

With two away in the seventh, Rockefeller singled to left, Jones singled to right and Rockefeller scored bases the right fielder let it go through him. Jones, who took third on the error, scored the final tally a moment later when Alexander singled to left.
