Eaton Explains Hospital Situation

The following is a reprint of an editorial appearing in last week's Plymouth Mail, with the signature of Sterling Eaton, publisher of the Mail, and General Chairman of the St. Mary's Hospital Building Fund.

In the editorial, Mr. Eaton explains the status of the Hospital Building Fund to the present time.

This is Michigan Hospital Week. It is also National Hospital Week. It is the week when the largest possible public interest will be focused on this country's hospitals and similar institutions.

It is also probably the best week in our year for talks about the proposed St. Mary's Hospital which is presently carrying on a most desperate fight to gain more funds, to bring about its construction.

The original survey made indicated the fact that major industry wanted and would support such an undertaking. However, at the time St. Mary's Hospital was known to any of the interested parties participating in the drive, another more powerful association was being formed by major industries, which would bring the future of not only St. Mary's, but any other project which might depend on financial assistance from major industry if it were to become a reality.

Under the leadership of top industrialists such as Harlow Corfield, Henry Ford, John Coleman and a hundred others, the Metropolitan Building Fund of Detroit came into existence. Here major industry handed together and subscribed some fabulous sums of money in dollars to be granted to charitable institutions, hospitals, Y. M. and Y. W. C. A.'s, and the like.

Several boards were set up to hold hearings on the necessity of each project undertaken. Any soliciting funds from any participating industry were told, as were we who were working on St. Mary's, that if we were to be considered for financial aid we would have to channel our request through this organization in Detroit.

We were also told that to qualify for aid we must discontinue our active fund raising campaign and depend wholly on the decision of this group as to whether or not we needed a hospital in this area. Or at least, whether or not they thought we needed a hospital in this area, or whether or not they had a group, which included this or our major industry, would participate in this project.

The hospital program was duly presented to the Metropolitan Building Fund. Hearings were held and the first decision to be received from the Detroit organization reached this conclusion.

On the basis of a statistical study and an oral formula there appears to be no immediate community-wide need for acute care hospital beds in your area.

In this area for the hospitals working in this area and another attempt was made to point out the acute need for a hospital in this immediate area. At this writing, no further decision has been made by the Metropolitan Building Fund, however, the St. Mary's case was informed that in case the request for funds should be denied again, opportunity would be given at some time in June or July for them to appear before the board of directors of the Fund and again attempt to secure financial aid.

This case as Michigan Hospital Week and National Hospital week faded into the twilight, this now becomes one of America's industrial Fund, stands without a hospital or the necessary beds to care for the thousands of the thousands of people THEY are moving into our communities.

If serious consideration is given to a grant of aid to St. Mary's, it becomes more doubtful if the answer could conscientiously be no.
