River to the starting point at the Junior High school. Sandwiches, beer and beverages will be served immediately following the parade at the Post Home to members of the Groves - Walker American Legion Post and their families as well as all others taking part in the parade. Post Commander Pat Hoffmann stated.

Joseph H. DeVriendt will be the grand marshal for the Farmington parade.

On Sunday, May 30, all veterans are invited to attend regular services at the Salem Evangelical and Reformed Church in a body. Members will assemble at the Farmington Police Station at 9:30 a.m. and proceed to the church from there.

The Novi parade will start at the Community House and proceed to the Novi Cemetery and then to the Oakland Hills Cemetery, returning again to the Community Building. Ceremonies will be conducted at both cemeteries. Groups which will be participating will be the Amvets and Auxiliary, Gold Star and Blue Star Mothers and Fathers, the Odd Fellows, the Elks, the American Legion, the Brownie and Cub units from the area.

The Walled Lake High School band, along with the V. F. W. and its Auxiliary, from Walled Lake, will also take part in the parade.

Kenneth Ripney, commander of the Perry/Kennel Amvet Post, will serve as grand marshal of the Novi parade.

The Clarenceville parade, starting at 12 noon from the Grand River - Eight Mile intersection, will be participated in by the V. F. W., the American Legion, Farmington and Scout units and various other groups from the Clarenceville area. Led by the Clarenceville High School band and Clarenceville Cemetery Association, groups will parade to the Clarenceville Cemetery for official memorial ceremonies there.

to dial direct to selected points throughout the United States as well as to more than 70 communities in Southeastern Michigan.

The Farmington building will include two sections, an equipment wing measuring 60 feet by 100 feet, and a service wing 20 feet by 50 feet. Scheduled for completion in December of this year, the one-story structure will be of brick and stone exterior. Officials stated that installation of equipment will begin immediately after completion of the building.

suggested by the Committee.

THE BOARD was informed by A. G. Leonard, Township Attorney, that an amendment to the Town Hall court decree has been signed, authorizing the Township Clerk to act as custodian of the premises. Under the new amendment, signed by Judge Doty, the Township Clerk will handle all reservations for the securing of additional equipment for the northeast fire station, pending further investigation. The installation of a 500 gallon pump and securing of an additional 1,100 feet of hose has been requested by the Michigan Inspection Bureau if lower insurance rates are to be afforded in the Franklin Knolls Subdivision. The Board indicated they wanted to check the water capacity in the subdivision as well as determining the reduction in rates before any action was taken.

A motion was made and approved to review the contract of A. G. Leonard as Township Attorney on the same terms as last year. The contract covers the period from May 12, 1954, to May 12, 1955.

an order and is expected to be delivered in about three weeks. This will replace the pump that broke down a week ago. James Tennant, City Manager, stated that the present two pumps will maintain a normal pressure. The third pump will afford extra protection during dry periods and will help distribute the load among all of the units.


Tennant stated that in addition to these present steps, plans are being made for the drilling of a test well on the city-owned property located on Oakland at Gill Roads. A check will also be made of a known well located in the fire hall building on Liberty Street. If this well is found to be satisfactory a pump will be installed and the water supply tied into the present system.

the bank gave short talks at the dinner. Byron E. Lapham, executive vice-president and one of the original employees, recalled opening day 20 years ago. The opening day deposits of \$200,000 have grown to over \$10 1/2 million, today. Twenty years ago the bank had three regular employees and two part-timers, while today they have 41 regular employees and 10 part-time. The capital of the bank has jumped from \$37,500 to over \$500,000.

The workers are building the land out of a swampy Gun Lake peninsula at the popular state recreation area southwest of Hastings.

The conservation commission recently set aside \$100,000 of its state parks capital outlay budget for work at the area this summer, continuing a development program started several years ago.

Hydraulic lifts will move dirt from the lake floor for deposit on the swampy tip of land. Later, the area will be topped and seeded.

Also slated is \$75,000 in work on a south boundary road in Porcupine Mountains state park. At present, the park is accessible to the public only through the northern shoreline road. The new road will provide use of southern wilderness areas in the huge park. Inmate labor will be used in the work.

Other work includes \$30,000 in construction of toilet, laundry and shower buildings at Sleeper, Algonquin, Tahquamenon Falls and Porcupine Mountains state parks. At Ludington state park, \$30,000 will be used for removing a number of old buildings, construction of a staff quarters and development of the Hamlin Lake day use area.


