

OCC Helps Drive In Spanish

An Oakland Community College professor has helped translate into Spanish "What Every Driver Must Know," the official drivers publication of the Michigan secretary of state's office.

Dr. Charles Braun, who teaches Spanish on the Orchard Ridge campus in Farmington, worked with Dr. Gary Scavnick of Wayne State University on the publication.

Braun, an Oak Park resident, has been at Orchard Ridge since 1968.

The manual was completed under the auspices of Detroit's International Institute. The professors were almost done with their translation when the state came out with a new version. After they had worked more than a year on it, the manual was finally published.

Cities Get More Highway Funds

Observerland cities are benefiting from an increase in revenue from the motor vehicle highway fund which has averaged 8.6 per cent higher in Michigan for the first quarter of 1973.

Wayne County has received \$9.3 million for the first quarter of 1973 compared to \$8.4 million for the first quarter of 1972. Oakland County's share increased from \$3.75 million to \$4.1 million.

The increase reflects a growth in fuel consumption as well as an increase in the gas tax to nine cents a gallon.

There still are 500 openings for Boy Scouts at the Clinton Valley Boy Scout Council's summer camp at Lost Lake Scout Reservation. Eight camping periods are scheduled for the summer: June 24-30; July 1-7; 8-14; 15-21; 22-28; July 29-Aug 4; Aug. 5-11; and 12-18.

Fee for a one-week period is \$33, and includes meals, housing and a full program of merit badge and advancement activities conducted by a trained adult scouting staff.

Wallace W. Edwards, president of the Clinton Valley Council, urged parents of scouts to enroll their boys soon for one of the summer camping periods, if they haven't already done so.

OCC Gets Federal Job Funds

Oakland Community College will hire 12 veterans as part time counselor-aides with the \$19,075 it has received in emergency employment funds.

The funds will be matched with \$2,120 in local funding. Unemployed veterans who attend OCC are eligible and can apply to the dean of students on any of the college's four campuses.

Orchard Ridge is the college's Farmington campus and is located between Orchard Lake and Farmington Rds., south of I-696.
