Notice Of Special Election Of The Qualified Electors Of School District No. 5, Fractional, Of The Townships Of Farmington, Livonia and Redford, Oakland and Wayne Counties, Michigan

TO THE QUALIFIED ELECTORS OF SAID SCHOOL DISTRICT:

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE that a special election of the qualified electors of the aforesaid school district will be held in the Clarenceville High School located at 20210 Middlebelt Road in said school district on MONDAY, JULY 19, 1954, and at such special election the following propositions will be submitted to the qualified electors of the school district.

PROPOSITION I. BONDING PROPOSITION:

Shall School District No. 5 Fractional of the Townships of Farmington, Livonia and Redford, Oakland and Wayne Counties, Michigan, borrow the sum of not to exceed Three Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$350,000) and issue its bonds therefor for the purpose of constructing new additions of school-houses within the school district, acquiring necessary additions to school sites, and for furnishing and equipping the same?

PROPOSITION II. MILLAGE INCREASE PROPOSITION:

Shall the limitation on the total amount of taxes which may be assessed against all property in School District No. 5 Fractional, of the Townships of Farmington, Livonia and Redford, Oakland and Wayne Counties, Michigan, for all purposes except payment of obligations incurred before December 8, 1932, be increased as provided by Section 21, Article X of the Constitution of Michigan by six-thirty-seconds of one percent (0.3333%) of the assessed valuation, as equalized, of all property in the school district for a period of twenty (20) years from 1954 to 1974, both inclusive, to be used for the sole purpose of paying principal and interest and meeting other requirements established for payments of bonds to be issued in the aggregate principal sum of Three Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$350,000.00) for the purpose of constructing school buildings within the school district, for acquiring necessary additions to school sites, and for furnishing and equipping the same?

The Polls of Election Will Be Open from 7 A.M. to 8:00 P.M. Eastern Standard Time

Each person voting on the proposition to increase the total tax-rate limitation may be a citizen of the United States, above the age of Twenty-one (21) years, and have resided in the State of Michigan six (6) months and in the school district thirty (30) days next preceding the day of election.
